Peewee fastball team hopes to qualify for Eastern Canadian championships

When the Stouffville Storm peewee boys' fastball team takes to the ball diamond this season the players will have a little extra incentive going for them.

While the team is attempting to win the York Region Softball Association title, they also have their sights set on a trip to Placentia, Nfld.

That's where the Eastern Canadian peewee fastball championships will take place from Aug. 25-28.

But to make their way out east, the Storm must win an elimination tournament they will host at Memorial Park July 1-3.

The length of the elimination tournament will depend on the number of entries, said June Doner, Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Softball Association president.

The top two clubs from that event will go to Newfoundland.

Through the Storm's first four league contests, they appear to be on target as they are undefeated.

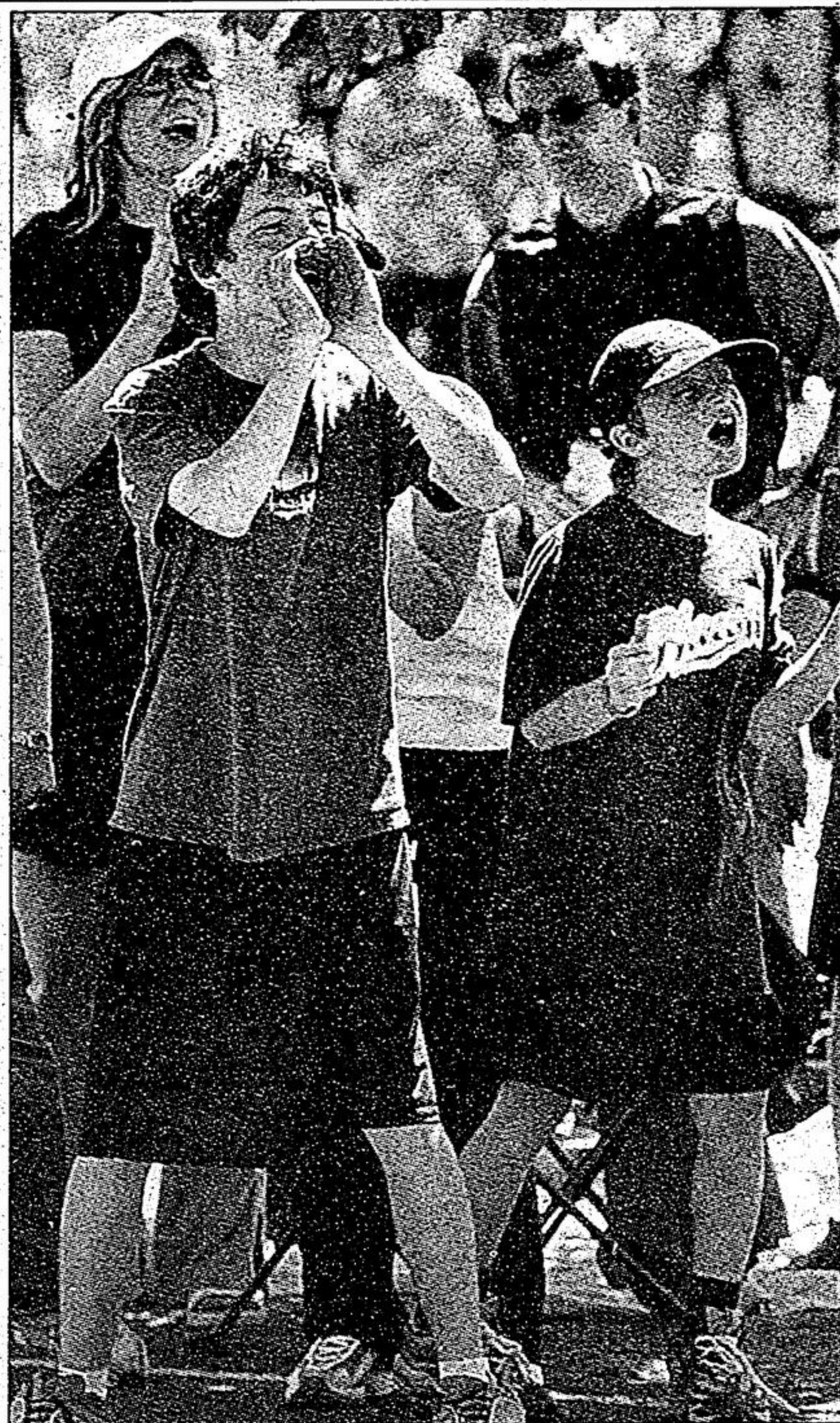
In a road rematch with Oshawa last Thursday, the Storm bats sounded off in a 12-2 win.

Returning to Memorial Park Wednesday, the Jones Pools entry routed the Newmarket Mudhens 8-0.
