New Waxers'ownership is ready to take charge

Three-man team to control junior A team's fortunes

For several years, Joe Cornacchia had a dream.

The 56-year-old Whitchurch-Stouffville resident wanted to own the Markham Waxers junior A hockey club.

That dream became a reality Thursday when the Provincial Junior A Hockey League's board of governors officially approved the sale of the team to a group led by Cornacchia from Don Bremner, a Ballantrae resident who had owned the club since 1994.

Terms of the transaction were not disclosed.

"We've been working to do this deal for over three years," Cornacchia said Friday. "We didn't think it would come through because every time we talked to Don (Bremner) about it, he had second thoughts on selling the team. Don will always be Mr. Waxer in town because he's been associated with the team for so many years.

"But it's a relief, it feels good and we're happy about it."

A former president of the Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association, whose term ended earlier this year, Cornacchia accepted the job of director of hockey operations with with the Stouffville Spirit, also of the Provincial league, this spring.

But when the opportunity to purchase the Waxers came up on short notice, he resigned from the Spirit.

"That's the reason why I took the job in Stouffville in the first place, because I didn't think this opportunity (to own the Waxers) would happen, but it did all of a sudden," he said.

Cornacchia is part of a threeman ownership group that includes his brother Rick, a 51year-old Unionville resident and manager of the National Training Rink in Richmond Hill, and Robert Thissen, a Toronto resident who is chairperson of Promittere Capital Group and has been involved in the Greater Toronto Hockey League as a sponsor of the Promittere Cup, .

Toronto Red Wings bantams and minor midgets, will take over the head coaching position.

Named to the assistant coaching positions were Jason Goldenberg, a Markham resident and former player with the Waxers from 1996-98, Darryl Sauro, who helped coach the Waxers junior A goalies last season, and Glenn Towsend, a former Markham resident who assisted Rick Cornacchia during his time with the minor Waxers organization.

Joe Cornacchia said the organization's priority is to "continue the tradition but develop a new attitude".

The club wants to work closely with the Waxers' minor hockey organization and develop youngsters to aspire to play for the junior A hockey team.

"There's a lot of good hockey players who live in Markham and we want to keep them in this town," he said.

Introducing Mike Ralph as the club's vice-president of marketing, Cornacchia said the club intends to be more aggressive in this area and to give the team a greater presence in the commu-

Among programs the team is working on, Cornacchia said, are to try and get an additional 30 minutes of ice time after the games to allow youngsters to skate with some of the players, to incorporate a learn to read program with elementary school students and to assist with the Waxers' house league programs.

"We want to be totally involved with the community," Cornacchia said. "We want Fri-Markham."
