For the second consecutive race, the Stouffville-area resident set a good pace on the 10-turn road course by capturing the pole position for the 51-lap feature event.

Staying in contention for the entire race, Gibbons received a scare with just two laps remaining when his car tangled with Kerry Micks', sending both cars spinning.

Gibbons, however, got back on the track and settled for a fourth-place finish.

Upon conclusion of the race, Gibbons earned the Goodyear Belts and Hoses Gatorback Fastest Lap Award after posting the fastest lap of

the race on lap 42 with a time of 1:26.183.

Through three of 12 races, Gibbons occupies fourth place in the overall standings with 434 points and trails series leader Don Thomson Jr. by 53 points.

The next CASCAR Super Series event is scheduled to take place July 1-3 in Barrie with the running of the Dodge Charger 300 presented by the Dodge Dealers of Ontario.
