

Stouffville team bowls up storm to win district women's title

A women's foursome, representing the Stouffville Lawn Bowling Club, advanced to the provincial championships before losing to London and Milton.

Skip Jane Hachey, vice Doris Farthing, second Glenda Dunkeld and lead Brenda Farthing captured the Ontario Lawn Bowls District 13 four's competition at Monora, near Orangeville.

That qualified them for the provincial tournament in St. Catharines.

In the six-team, double knock-out tournament, Stouffville defeated Balmy Beach and Milton in their first two outings before losing their third match to London.

The following day, the Stouffville foursome were eliminated after losing to Milton.

London proceeded to claim the gold; Oshawa, the silver and Milton the bronze. London and Oshawa qualified to compete at the national championships in Kitchener and Woodstock.

Dunkeld back from heart surgery to call balls, strikes

You can't keep a good man down. Nor for that matter a good umpire.

A year after undergoing triple heart bypass surgery, Cliff Dunkeld, a veteran Stouffville sports personality, has donned the umpire's gear again.

The 73-year-old Dunkeld, active playing days began at age 16 in the Claremont Community Fastball League, is calling balls and strikes in several leagues around Whitchurch-Stouffville.

Among those include a men's slo-pitch league in Goodwood; the Tuesday Night Ladies League in Stouffville; a bantam girls' house league in Stouffville and a co-ed slo-pitch league at Willowgrove.

"That's where my heart is," says Dunkeld. "The ball diamond is my second home."

In addition to playing and umpiring, Dunkeld also coached for many years, including time spent as a fastball mentor at North York's Seneca College.

The former town councillor also helped launch girls' hockey in Stouffville in the 1970s.
