**SOUTHEAST COLLECTOR TRUNK SEWER ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT**

As part of the Southeast Collector Trunk Sewer Environmental Assessment (EA), the Regional Municipality of York and the Regional Municipality of Durham are submitting a Terms of Reference (ToR) to the Ontario Ministry of the Environment (MOE) for formal review as required under the provincial *Environmental Assessment Act*. If approved, the ToR will provide the framework for the preparation and review of the EA for the proposed undertaking.

The purpose of the proposed undertaking is to accommodate the additional sanitary sewer flows projected from future growth as allowed for in the Regional Municipality of York's Official Plan. A reasonable range of alternatives will be considered in the EA. The initial Study Area presented in the draft ToR has been enlarged and is identified in the Key Map below. Durham Region is a co-proponent with York Region on the EA since a portion of the study area is within Durham Region, and Durham and York Regions are co-owners of the existing York Durham Sewage System (YDSS) within Durham Region.

The public review period for the ToR will be from **July 22, 2005 to August 26, 2005**. You may review the ToR during normal hours of operation at the following locations:

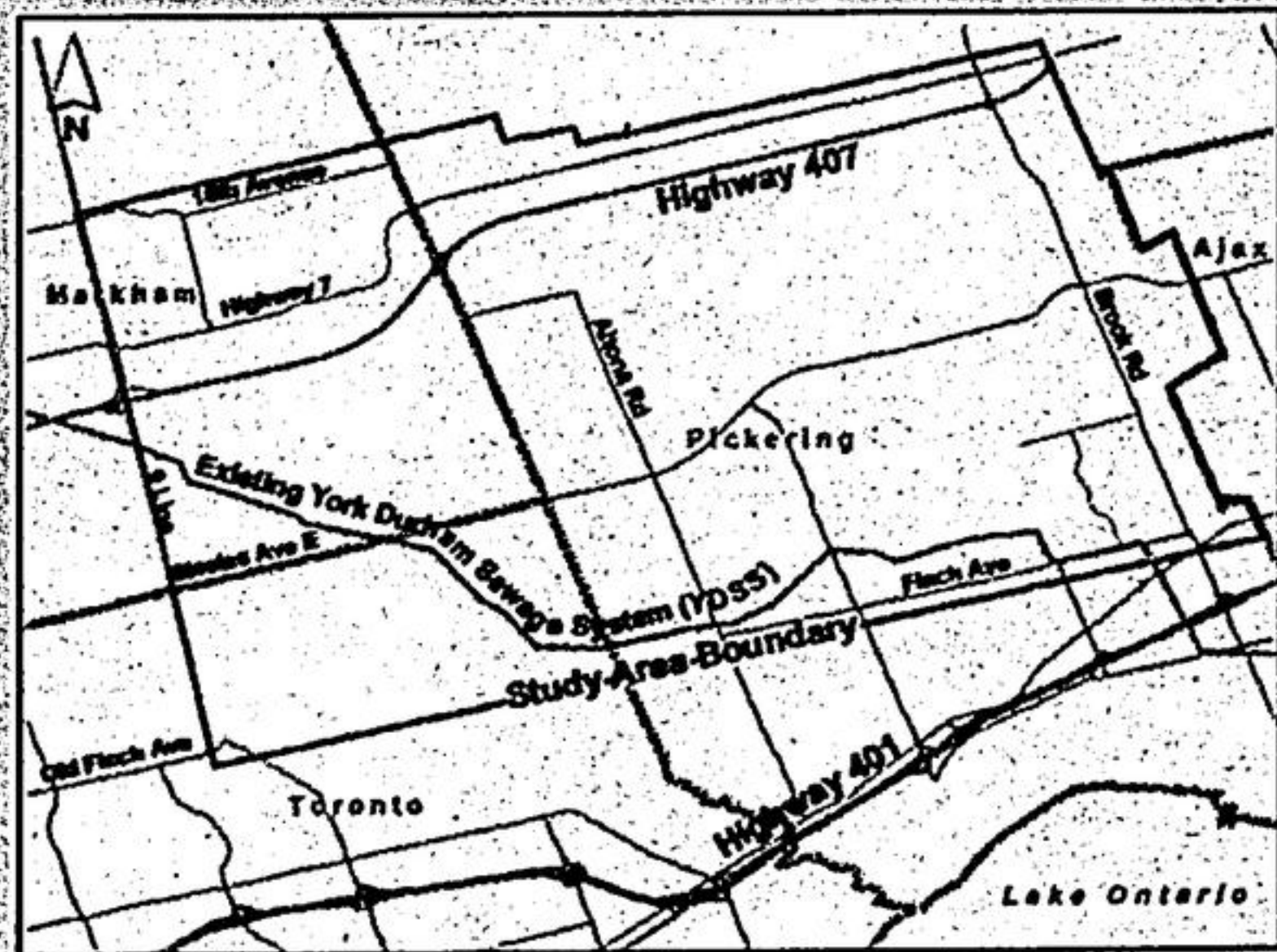

# Stouffville man relieved son, grandson OK

Jr., 12, of Uxbridge were in a wreck.

Mr. Bruce rushed to the scene where he learned his son and grandson were the only ones to escape injury.

"My son's okay and the boy's okay," Mr. Bruce Sr. said. "They were very lucky."

Joe DiCarlo, a Richmond Hill truck driver, was getting gas at the corner Esso station when the accident occurred.

"I heard a boom noise and saw debris flying everywhere," Mr. DiCarlo said. "One dump truck had turned over. It was a horrific thing to see. As a trucker, it upset me. I don't know why people drive so fast."

OPP reported a dump truck traveling east on Bloomington Road went through a red light colliding with a Suzuki traveling southbound on Hwy. 48.

The empty dump truck then rolled, crushing a Ford Crown Victoria and smashing into another truck, which forced a silver Chrysler Intrepid to smash into the back of the second truck.

"This just goes to show that a milli-second can change your life or take your life," OPP Sgt. Jack Reppard said.

It was traffic chaos in the area when police closed a section of both highways for most of the day.

Truck traffic along Bloomington Road is very heavy, tow truck driver Steve Muirhead of Stouffville said.

"Many of the truckers are paid by the load," Mr. Muirhead said. "The truckers try to get as many loads delivered as they can. They aren't paid by the hour. It puts a lot of stress on the drivers."

The OPP continue to investigate the accident.
