Mrs. MacLaren's daughter, Heather who is 28, will also join the walk.

Mrs. MacLaren, her husband, Robert, and grand daughter, Hayley, were among those volunteering at the car wash.

The family has lived in Whitchurch-Stouffville for 22

"There is not a day that goes by that one of our customers, family, neighbours and friends have not been diagnosed with cancer or died with cancer," she said.

She believes that individuals can make a difference, citing the influence Terry Fox still has 25 years after his cross-Canada marathon to raise money for cancer research.

Last year, over 4,500 walkers took part in the Weekend to End Breast Cancer, raising close to \$15 million.

More than 150,000 donors

contributed to the walkers.

To raise funds for herself and her daughter, Mrs. MacLaren has held garage sales and sold tickets for a giveaway through her Merry Maids home cleaning business in Uxbridge.

Patrons had a chance to win free housecleaning for three months and a spa and dinner day.

To train for the event, Mrs. MacLaren walks regularly and tries to jog 20 km on weekends.

Mrs. MacLaren has participated in the annual Relay for Life to support the Canadian Cancer Society and organized the first Relay for Life in North Durham last year.

Hosted by local songwriter Don Quarles, the event is a chance to highlight and celebrate music made by Whitchurch-Stouffville residents.




"We are trying to get a real mix of diferent groups," Mr. Quarles


