

Storm field silver in Eastern Canadian final

The Stouffville Storm peewees advanced to the final of the Eastern Canadian Softball Championships in Placentia, Nfld. before settling for the silver medal after incurring a 7-1 loss to the Napanee Express in Sunday's championship final.

With rain invading the area during the first day of the tournament last Friday, the Storm required two days to defeat Nova Scotia (East Hants) 9-6 in their first game.

Trailing 6-2, the Storm battled back to tie the game at 6-6 before rain forced the game to be continued Saturday morning.

Later that day, the Storm had an easier time of things in their next game against Torbay (Newfoundland) as they cruised to an 8-0 win.

The Storm capped off the day by routing host Placentia 12-2.

Facing provincial archrival Napanee Express Sunday, the Storm fell 7-5.

Despite the loss, the Storm advanced to the medal round later that day and defeated Nova Scotia 11-6 to gain entry into the final.

"The kids gave it a good effort," said Storm spokesperson Peter Van Zeeland. "They wanted to be (in the championships) and they got there. Napanee just played better."

Scott Connor, Storm assistant coach, noted the rain played havoc not only by inconveniencing the tournament slate but field conditions too.

"There was water all over the place and we really didn't get started playing ball until Saturday," he said. "But the tournament was a lot of fun and it was a good experience for the boys."

Coached by Mike Heffernan, team members on the Storm included: Brian Hector, Doug Jones, Brandon McKenzie, Chris Paine, Braham Van Zeeland, Travis Connor, Bruce Cringan, Tyler Heffernan, Erick Espiritu-Santo, Robert Kay, Brandon Hampson, Nolan Benoit and Mike Finn.

Also assisting Heffernan on the bench were Mickey Finn and Rob Santo.
