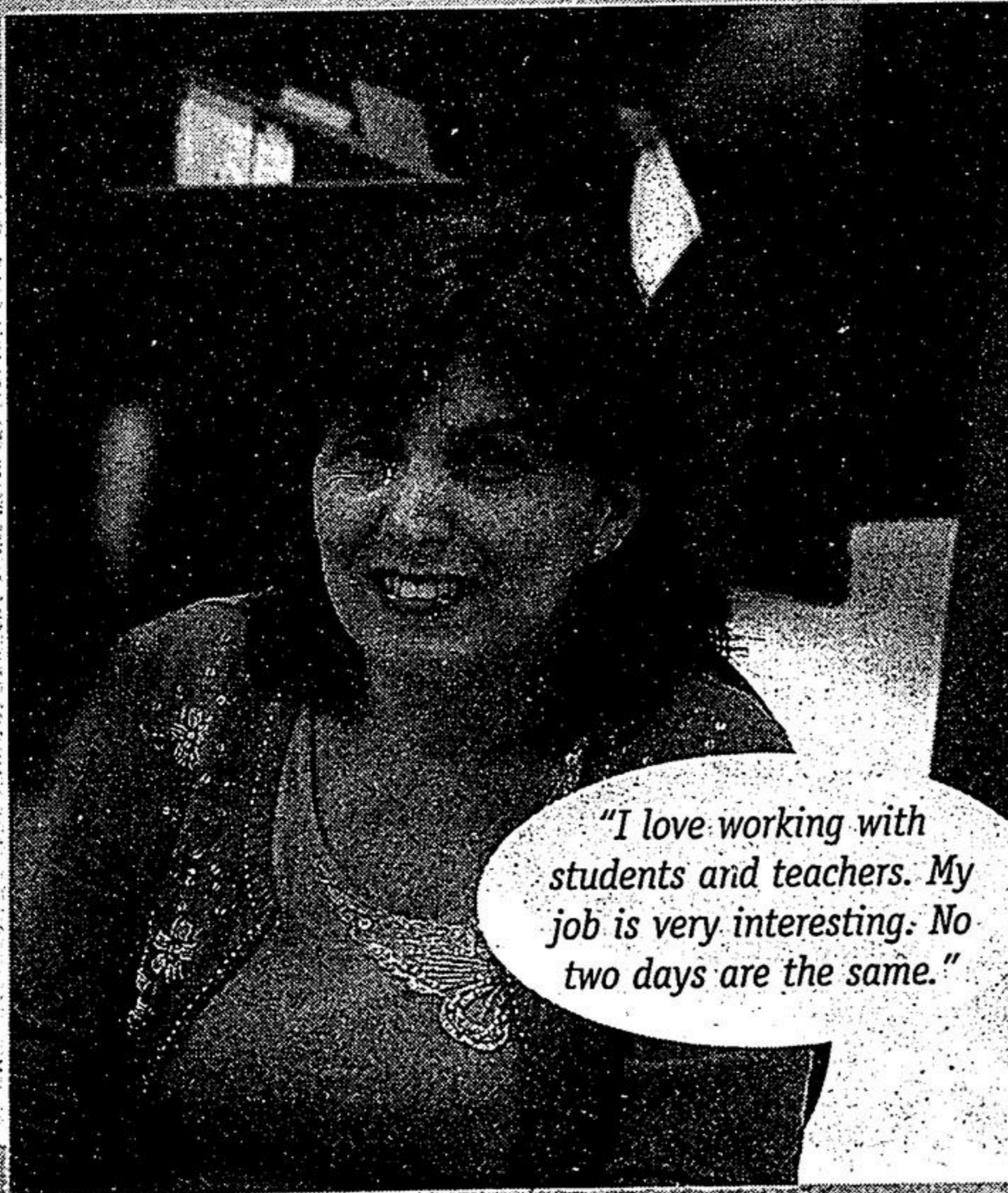

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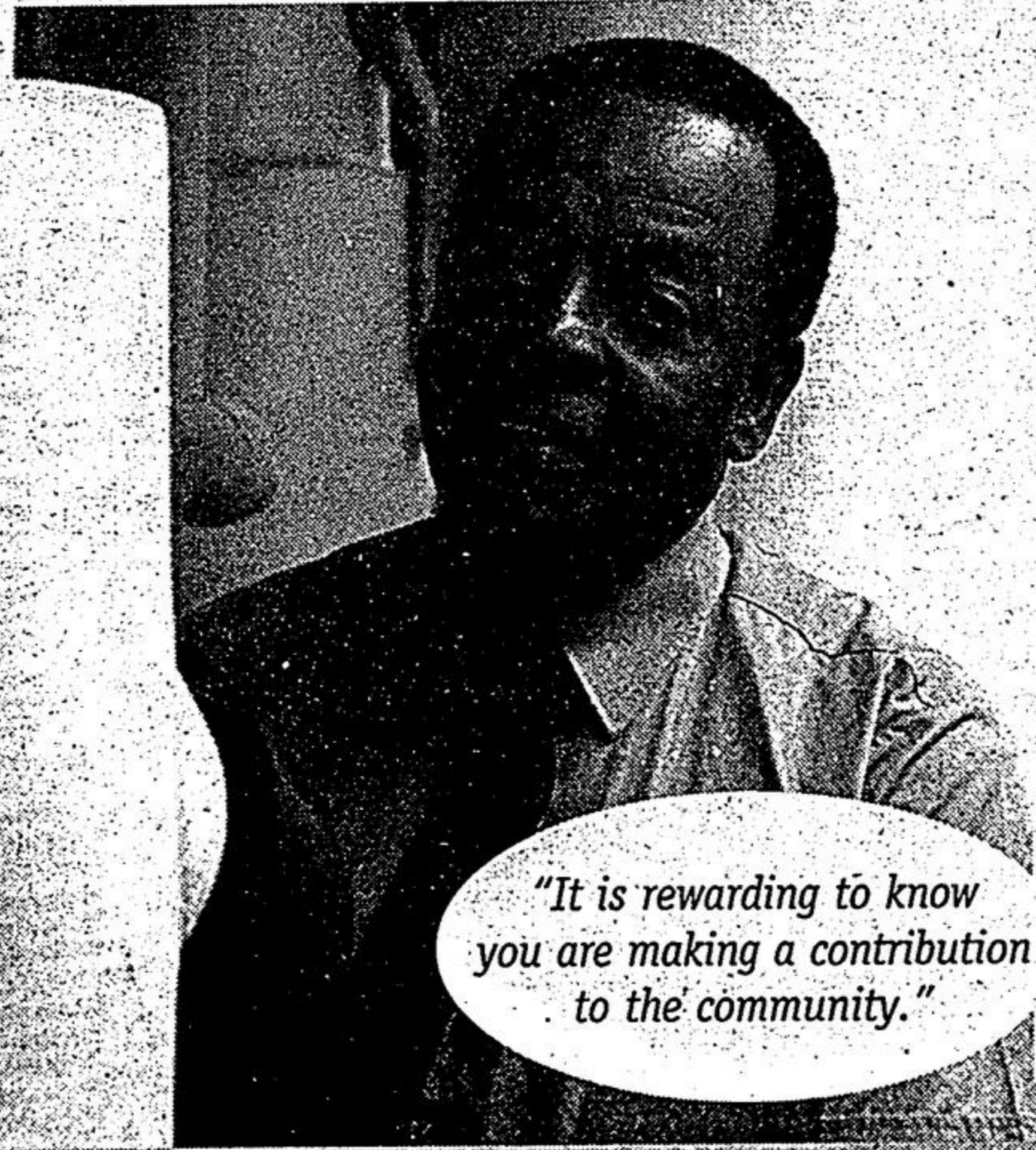


## Meet two dedicated people who work at schools in York Region...
