Lost loved ones centre of show

In her mind, Fenulla Jiwani is at a yoga retreat in India.

In reality, the 29-year-old Markham resident is touring with her latest production Light of India.

The show includes the use of music, dance and drama to tell a story.

It centres on two women who travel to an Indian yoga retreat to get over losing their husbands.

"It is (about) a common experience humans share around the loss of loved ones. It's that sense of wanting to connect, resolve and move on in life. These basic human emotions are similar.

There's a journey we all take."

Ms Jiwani plays a woman of Indian descent while Dawn Sadler plays a caucasian woman.

For Ms Jiwani, one of the most rewarding aspects of writing, directing and starring in the play came when a seven-year-old girl wrote a review of the production.

From the review, it was clear the girl understood the meaning behind the play.

"Although they (the women) were different, they both loved honest, caring men. Doesn't every woman want a man like that?", she wrote.

Some of the characters that appear in the play, such as the

rickshaw driver, are taken from Ms Jiwani's memories of a trip to India when she was 12.

The play also includes Bollywood dancing.

"I wanted to bring in traditional elements of dance and for people to feel like they are back in a Hindi film," Ms Jiwani said.

The production was launched at Montreal's fringe festival in June and has since travelled to London and Hamilton. At each venue, a portion of the proceeds goes to charity.

The show runs Sept. 21-25 and 28-30 at The Dancemakers Studio in Toronto's Historic Distillery District.
