On Thurs., Oct. 20 from 7-7:30 p.m., bring your little ones to the library in their pajamas and participate in the Sleepytime Storytime.

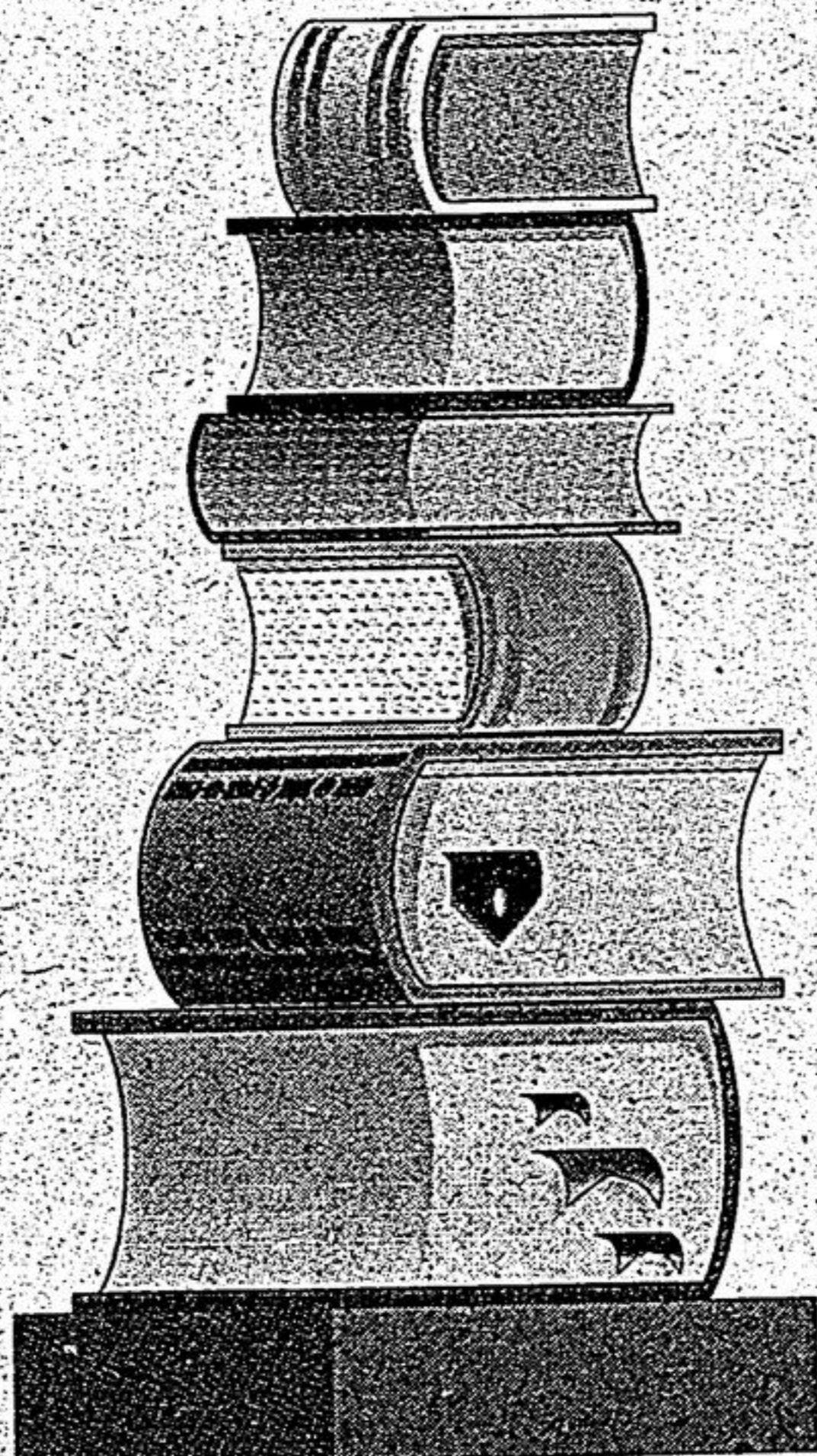

# Architecture Tour Challenge

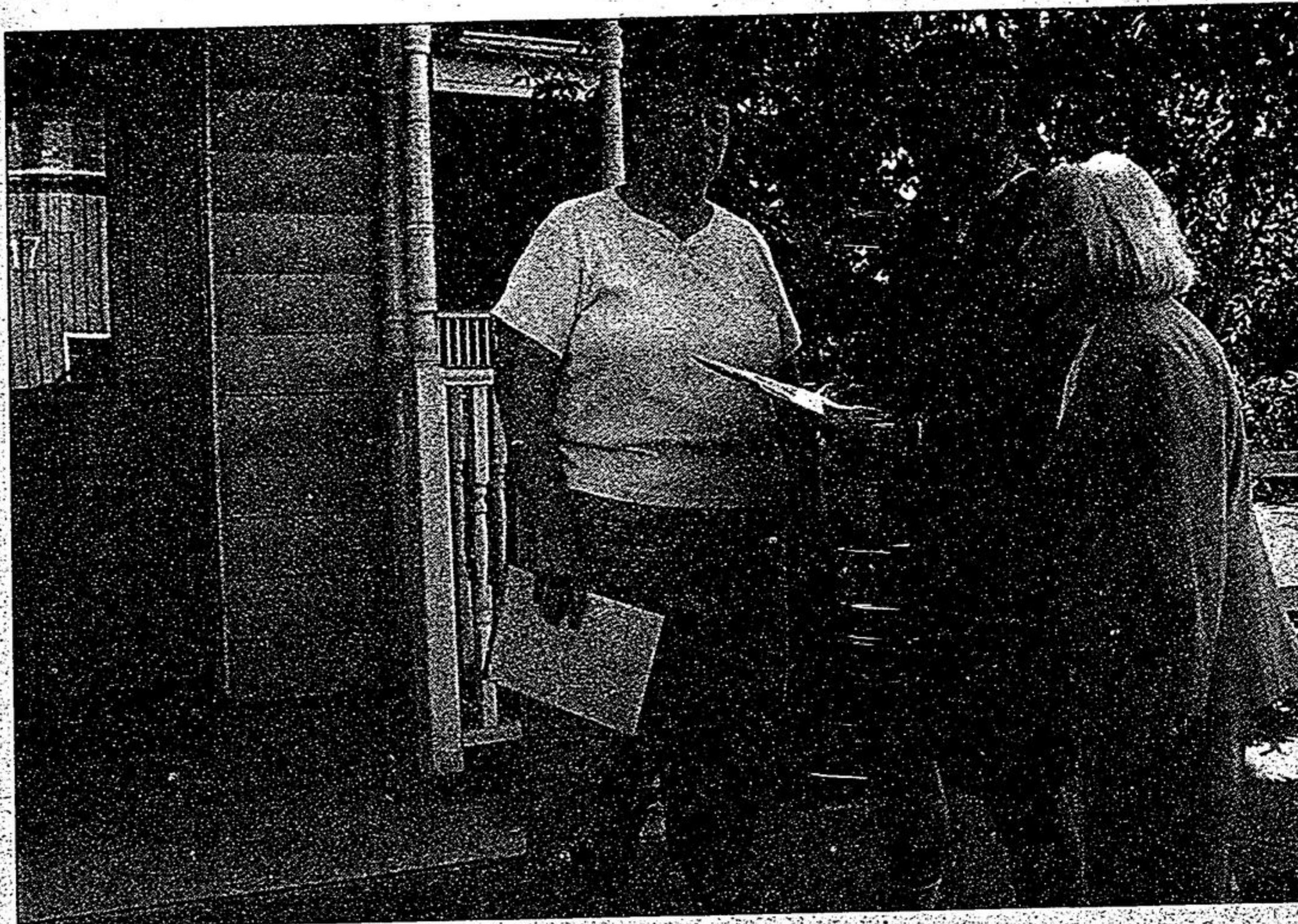
