*Spirit rookie scores a goal and earns an assist in 4-2 win*

Frank, 16, scored a highlight reel goal and assisted on another in the first period to lead the Stouffville Spirit to a 4-2 win over Huntsville Thursday at the Stouffville Arena.

The Spirit (6-2-2-3) moved into third place in the North Conference of the Provincial Jr. A Hockey League.

The goal saw Frank, a Barrie Colts Ontario Hockey League draft pick, spin away from a badly fooled Otter before blasting a shot into the top of the net.

"That was a confidence booster, I'd say," said the Thornhill resident, who played for the Toronto Red Wings minor midgets last season. "In this league, everything has to be done immediately. With the speed and the strength of the players, there's no time."
