Three-hour parking ticket catches visitor off-guard

Will the town's three-hour parking limit mean holiday visitors have to move their vehicles from the street between the end of the main course and the beginning of dessert?

It seemed so to one Stouffville resident who parked his car in front of his friend's house on a Sunday afternoon earlier this month. When he returned to his vehicle, he was shocked to find a \$30 parking ticket.

The ticket was for violating the town's three-hour parking limit — something he wasn't aware of since he's not a Stouffville resident.

The bylaw department responds to specific complaints about cars being left on streets too long, which means casual visitors are sometimes caught in the situation, senior bylaw enforcement officer Keith Saunders said.

When bylaw officers respond to a complaint, they must not only ticket the offending vehicle, but also check how long other vehicles on the street have been there.

The parking limit was designed to deal with cars that are left on streets for days on end. The bylaw is

also meant to help keep streets clear to allow safe passage by snowplows.

With snow and slippery roads not far off, residents are being encouraged to put their cars in their driveways, Mr. Saunders said.

"The road is not a parking lot."

That can become a problem when the five-car family only has room in the driveway for four of those vehicles.

Two of the vehicles recently ticketed by the town ended up having out-of-date licence stickers — two years out of date.

Signs noting the three-hour parking limit, which applies to all of Stouffville and rural hamlets in the municipality, are at each major entrance to town.

Each week, different streets generate complaints, Mr. Saunders noted.

Some parked cars also reveal other problems. Two of the vehicles recently ticketed by the town ended up having out-of-date licence stickers — two years out of date.
