Memorial Park and the adjacent parkland will undergo major changes when Park Drive is extended south through the area and the water pollution control plant is removed. Ball Diamonds Two and Three will have to be removed and other changes are possible.

New ball diamonds, soccer fields and other facilities are part of the plan for Bethesda Park.

We have added the ideas gathered from the Search Conference that was held on January 31, 2005 to other information such as: current and future facility needs, growth and change expectations for the Town, trends in leisure demand, the issues and opportunities presented by Memorial Park, and the plans of others. It is now time to imagine what is possible for Memorial Park and to move the planning process to the next stage. To help us with that, we would like your help.

If you are interested in attending this community input event, please register with the Leisure Services Department by January 12th. To help us prepare for this event, it is important that we know approximately how many people will be attending, so registration is crucial. A good number of community and interest group representatives, as well as Town Council and other community leaders have been invited to this session to ensure that we have good representation of the various interests relative to Memorial Park.
