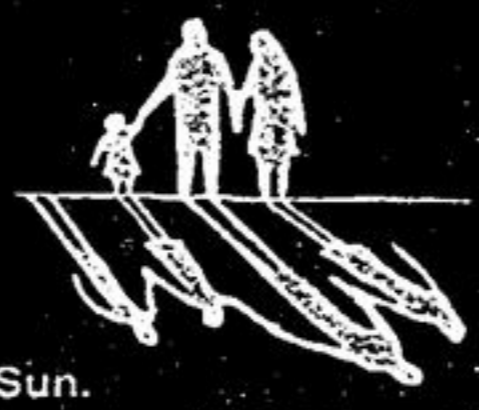


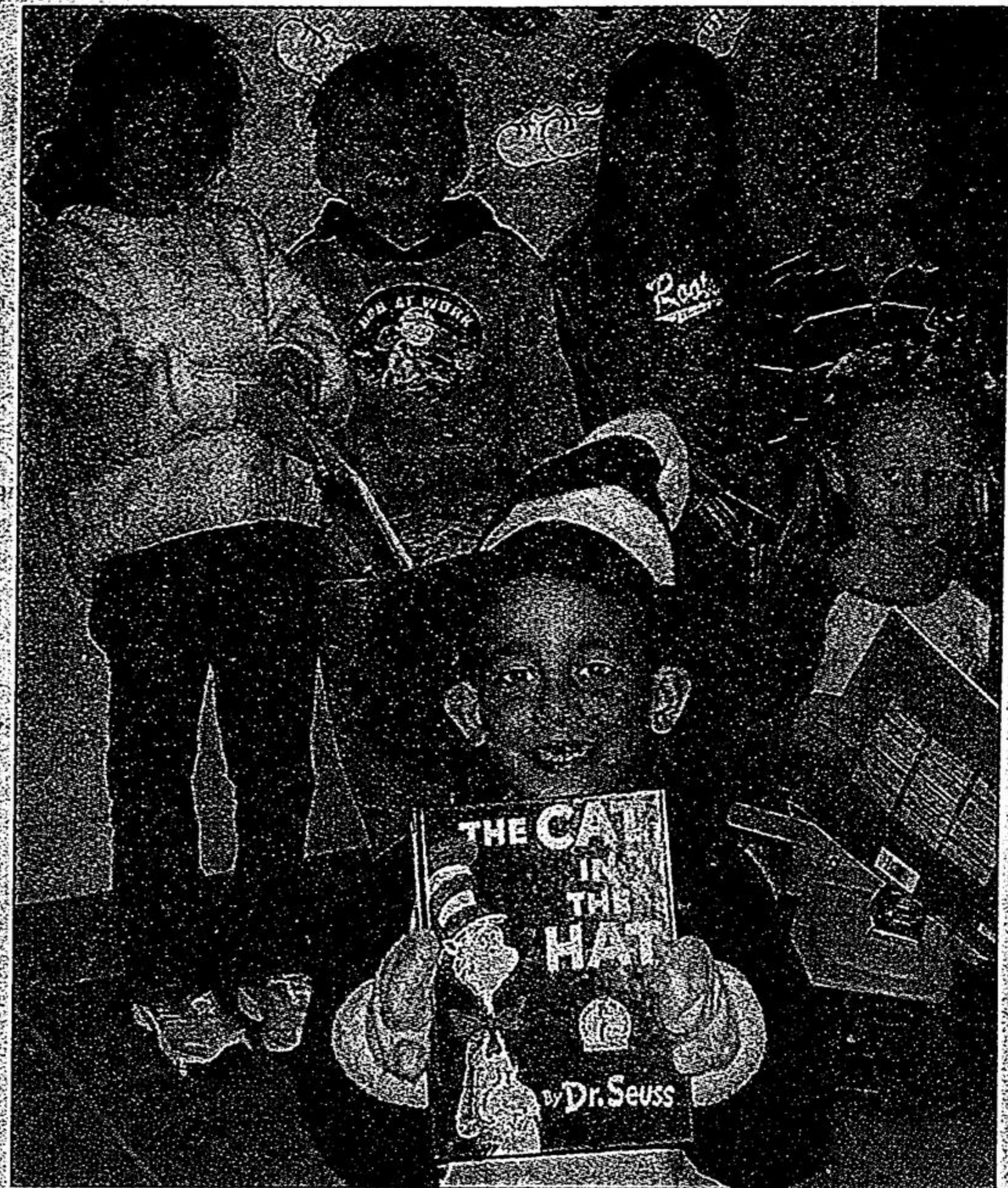

Stouffville Road (Regional Road 14) Improvements

 Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville  
 Class Environmental Assessment Study and Preliminary Design

The Regional Municipality of York is undertaking a Class Environmental Assessment for possible roadway improvements on Stouffville Road from west of Woodbine Avenue to east of Highway 48. The Study is being undertaken in accordance with the guidelines for a Schedule "C" Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) (June 2000). Public and review agencies are invited to provide input and comment for incorporation into the overall planning and design of this section of Stouffville Road.

The study has identified operational and capacity issues associated with this section of Stouffville Road, selected a preferred design concept and developed and compared alternative designs to address identified problems.

Public consultation is vital to selecting the preferred design. Staff from York Region and their consultants will be available at the Public Consultation Centre to discuss the study process, objectives, alternate design concepts, the recommended design alternative and the next steps involved in the study.
