

# B.C. Lions hope to get a kick or two out of Sciortino

*Markham native will miss playing football in Ottawa*

Sandro Sciortino was in the middle of making plans to resume his professional football career in Ottawa this year.

However, the 27-year-old Markham resident will be making a detour to Abbotsford, B.C. to attend the training camp of the B.C. Lions.

After the Canadian Football League folded the Ottawa Renegades for the upcoming season, players who were on the club's roster, which included Sciortino, were placed into a dispersal draft that took place last week.

As a kicker for the Renegades who was inactive during the 2005 season after being diagnosed with testicular cancer during his rookie campaign in September 2004, Sciortino was chosen by the Lions in the fourth round, 24th overall.

Appearing in the Renegades' first 14 games of the 2004 season and compiling 90 points on 17 of 30 field goals and 35 of 36 converts, Sciortino said he was a little surprised the Lions drafted him because they already signed

former Saskatchewan Roughriders' kicker and Surrey, B.C. native Paul McCallum as a free agent in February.

"I was definitely planning on going back to Ottawa," Sciortino said. "Thursday from my Markham residence. But the Lions are a great team and I like the coaching staff since I knew them when they were in Calgary and they originally drafted me (12th overall in the 2003 CFL college draft).

I've talked with Wally Buono (Lions' general manager and head coach) and he said it's my job to make his job more difficult

(as to who to keep on the roster). McCallum is a good kicker, and I'm sure the odds are in his favour (to make the team). I'll just have to go in there and try do my best."

Citing he now feels "100 per cent fine" and still visiting doctors for a bi-monthly physical examination, Sciortino accentuated the positive, saying with a good showing in training camp and the preseason, another CFL team could show interest in him if he were released.

Reflecting on what transpired in Ottawa, Sciortino said he casually monitored the situation during the offseason and thought the Renegades would find a way to stay afloat.

But he was disappointed when the final decision was made.

"I built some good relationships with people in Ottawa, but I'm sure I'll see the people that I know there at some point down the road," the Boston College and Brother Andre Catholic High School graduate said.

With a team folding in Ottawa for a second time, Sciortino isn't optimistic a third-time revival is likely to happen.

"They didn't get it right the second time, so I don't know how they can come back. It's too bad because Ottawa is a great town," he said.
