## Notice of Public Meeting

### The Regional Municipality of York Development Charges

Take notice that on Thursday June 8, 2006, the Finance and Administration Committee of the Regional Municipality of York will hold two public meetings pursuant to the Development Charges Act, 1997. The first public meeting will consider a proposed area specific by-law for the imposition of sanitary sewer development charges against land in the Nobleton Community. The second public meeting will consider a proposed amendment to the Region-wide development charges by-law, By-law No. DC-0005-2003-050, in order to exempt land in the Nobleton Community from the sanitary sewer development charge imposed under that by-law.

Regional Council will consider at a subsequent meeting the enactment of the proposed Development Charge By-Law applicable to lands in the Nobleton Community and the proposed amendment to By-Law No. DC-0005-2003-050.

Development charges are levied against new development, and are a primary source for funding growth-related capital expenditures. Regional capital services include water, wastewater, transportation (roads, transit) and general services (police, long term care, health, public works). The Nobleton-specific development charge is to fund the growth-related capital for sanitary sewers in Nobleton.

Regional Council is required under the Development Charges Act, 1997 to hold at least one public meeting to allow the public an opportunity to review and provide comments on the supporting documentation of the proposed By-Law and the By-Law amendment.

# Fewer, larger farms forced business to adapt

A business that knows how to roll with the punches and adapt to the future, while keeping that old-time atmosphere has received the heritage award from the Whitchurch-Stouffville Chamber of Commerce.

As the name implies, the award celebrates longtime local businesses.

Chas. Richards & Sons, which sells farm machinery and small construction equipment on Main Street, is now in its 77th year as a family business.

It was started by Don Richards' uncle, James Richards, in Agincourt in 1929. Don Richards' dad, Chas. Richards, took over in 1939.

The business has been in Stouffville since the winter of 1955-56 during the time a large part of the farming community left Agincourt for Stouffville.

Farms were much smaller, up to about 100 acres, several decades ago and so were the tractors. Don Richards noted. Farmers would have a few cattle, a few hogs, "A little

bit of everything," Mr. Richards said, "but none of it on a large scale."

Back then a couple of thousand dollars would buy a tractor.

Now, with huge acreages required to compete in the agricultural business, tractors have become larger and more specialized and price tags can range from \$10,000 to hundreds of thousands.

When Chas. Richards & Sons arrived in Stouffville,

there were about 15 farm equipment dealers already here. Now there is just one other.

To keep up with the changing times, the company now sells lawn and garden equipment and light-duty construction equipment.

The business has been kept all in the family. Mr. Richards' wife, Wanda, handles the bookkeeping and office work; his brother Bruce, although semi-retired, still has a role in the company and a nephew, Brian Richards, is active in the day-to-day business.

Farmers and property owners still flock to the famous pancake lunch the dealership serves up every March. Pickup trucks line Main Street on both sides as people drop by for a hearty stack of pancakes and syrup. Mr. Richards isn't sure when the tradition started, but figures it must be at least 40 years ago.

The business has a large customer base from throughout York Region and some from Durham.

All of the family members involved in the business have

been working there since they were youngsters.
