duced by the Liberals before the election, the report said.

And because the government decided to set the current lowest taxable amount at 15.5 per cent, Ottawa will make \$1.03-billion more in taxes than if the government had left the rate as it was, the report said.

So while the government claimed it was bringing in tax relief of \$1.67 billion, Global Insight says it increased taxes

\$1.03 billion.

"This is a fundamentally dishonest budget, which knowingly raised personal income taxes while telling Canadians they reduced them," alleged Mr. McCallum, a former finance minister and the Liberal treasury critic.

"The Conservative budget seems to be targeted at a transit-riding pensioner who continues to earn over \$120,000 at a job that requires \$1,500 worth of tools per year but goes to school

full-time and has a child under six who plays a lot of sports," Mr. McCallum said.

York-Simcoe Conservative MP Peter Van Loan took issue with allegations his government hasn't provided as much relief as it claimed in the budget. He listed policies such as the employee tax credit, sports tax credit and child care plan as examples of help.

"If you pretend those things don't exist, there might be some accuracy to that report," he said.

"There were a lot of changes we made, that we might not have considered if Kevin hadn't suggested them" says John.

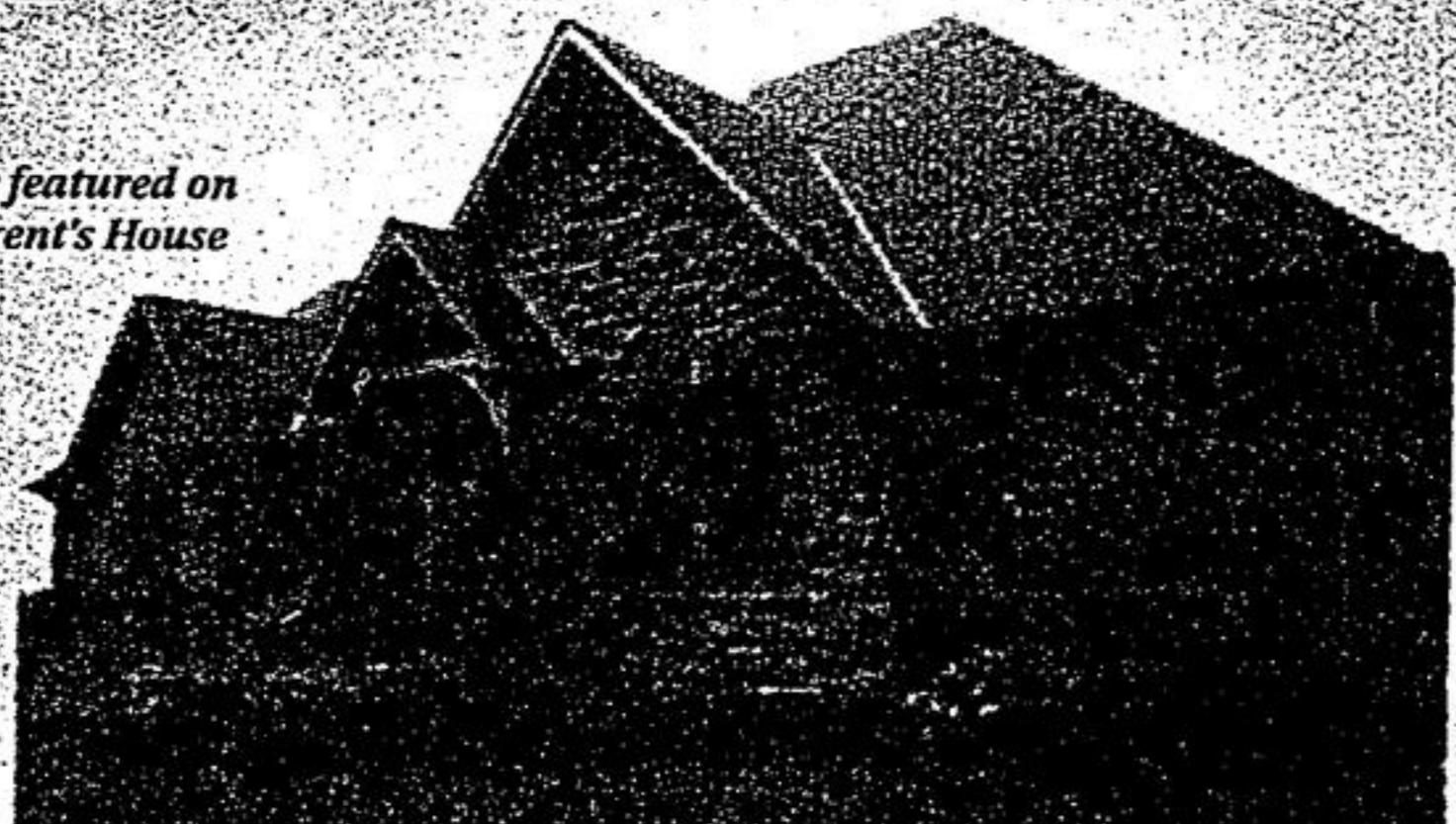

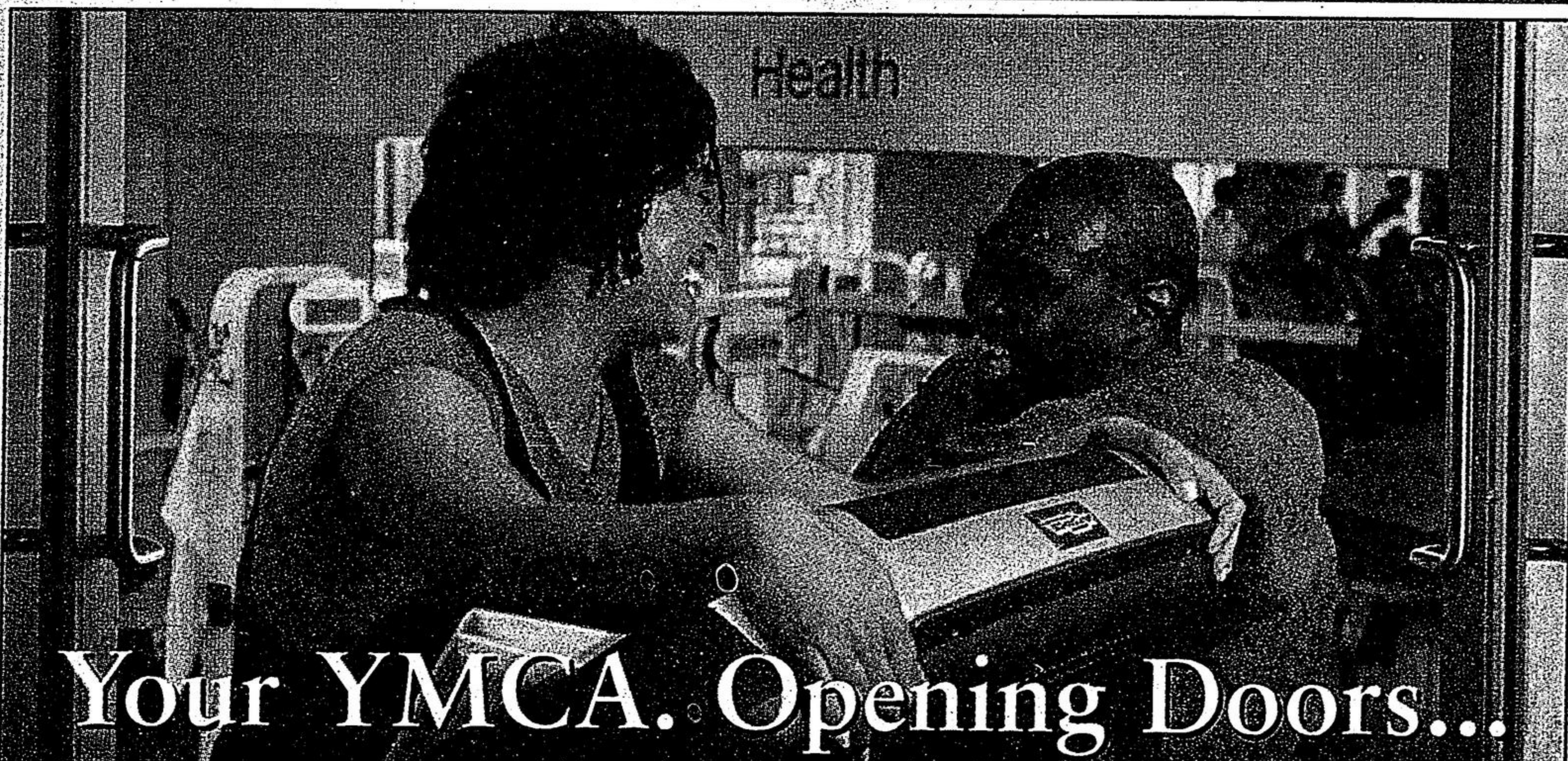
