WHAT IS LARVICIDING?

Larviciding is a safe and effective measure for the control of West Nile virus. The larvicide comes in slow-release pellet-like formulations and is administered when the mosquito is in the larval stage of development. It is not sprayed.

The larvicide is a synthetic growth hormone that interferes with the mosquito life cycle, preventing the mosquito larva from reaching maturity and reproduction. The larviciding products have been approved by both the provincial and federal governments and are considered safe for humans and the environment, when used properly.

NOTICE TO DESTROY NOXIOUS WEEDS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons in possession of land in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter W.5, Sections 3, 16 and 23 that unless the noxious weeds or weed seeds growing on their lands within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville are destroyed by June 15th, 2006 and throughout the season as often as it is necessary to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Council of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has appointed a Weed Inspector to cause said weeds or weed seeds to be destroyed in such a manner as he may deem proper, and that the expenses incurred by the said Weed Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall be placed on the Collector's Roll of the Municipality against the respective lands concerned and that such amount shall be collected in the same manner as taxes. Although Dandelions, Burdock and Goldenrod are not considered noxious weeds within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville under the Weed Control Act, the co-operation of all citizens is solicited in the elimination of these nuisance weeds.
