

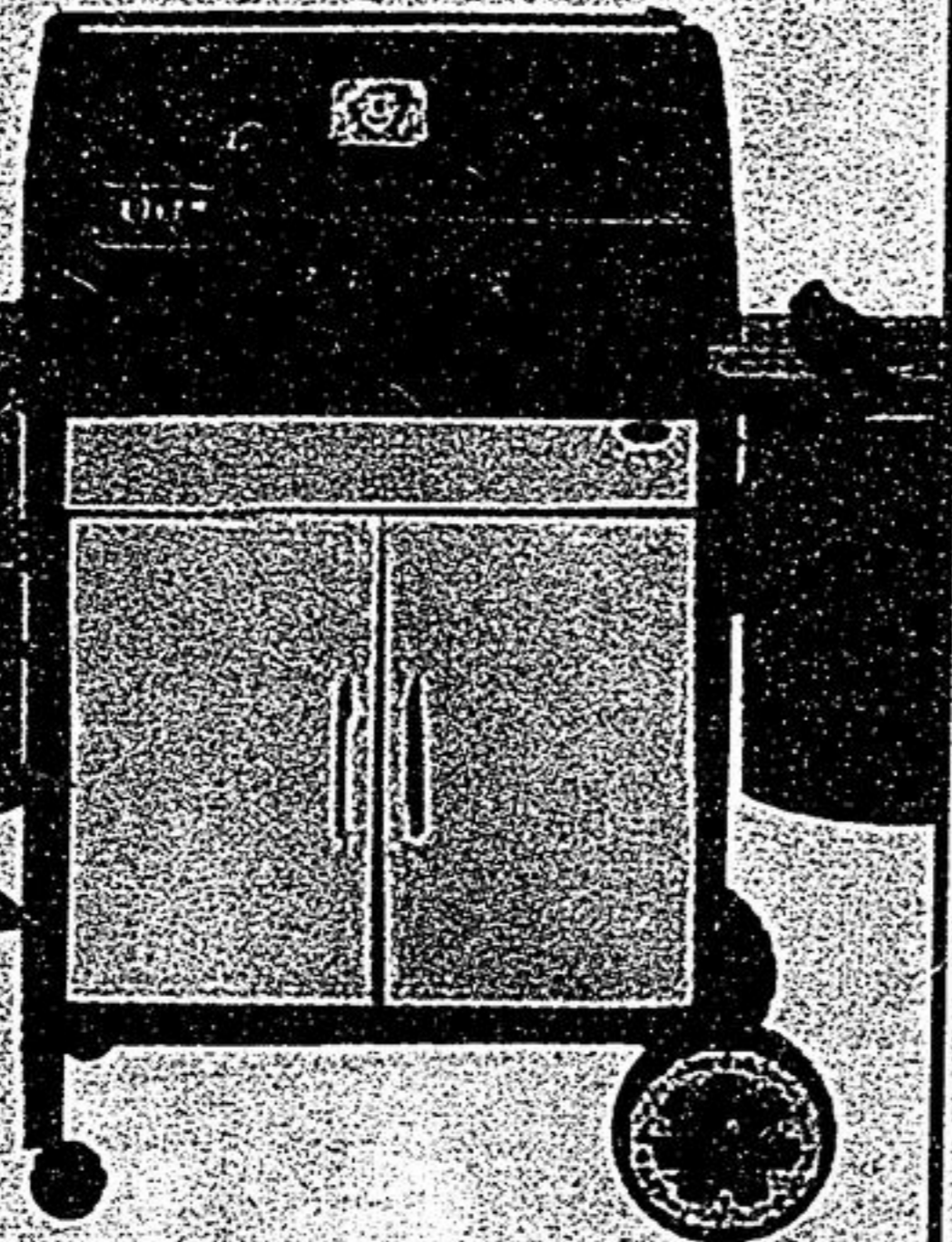

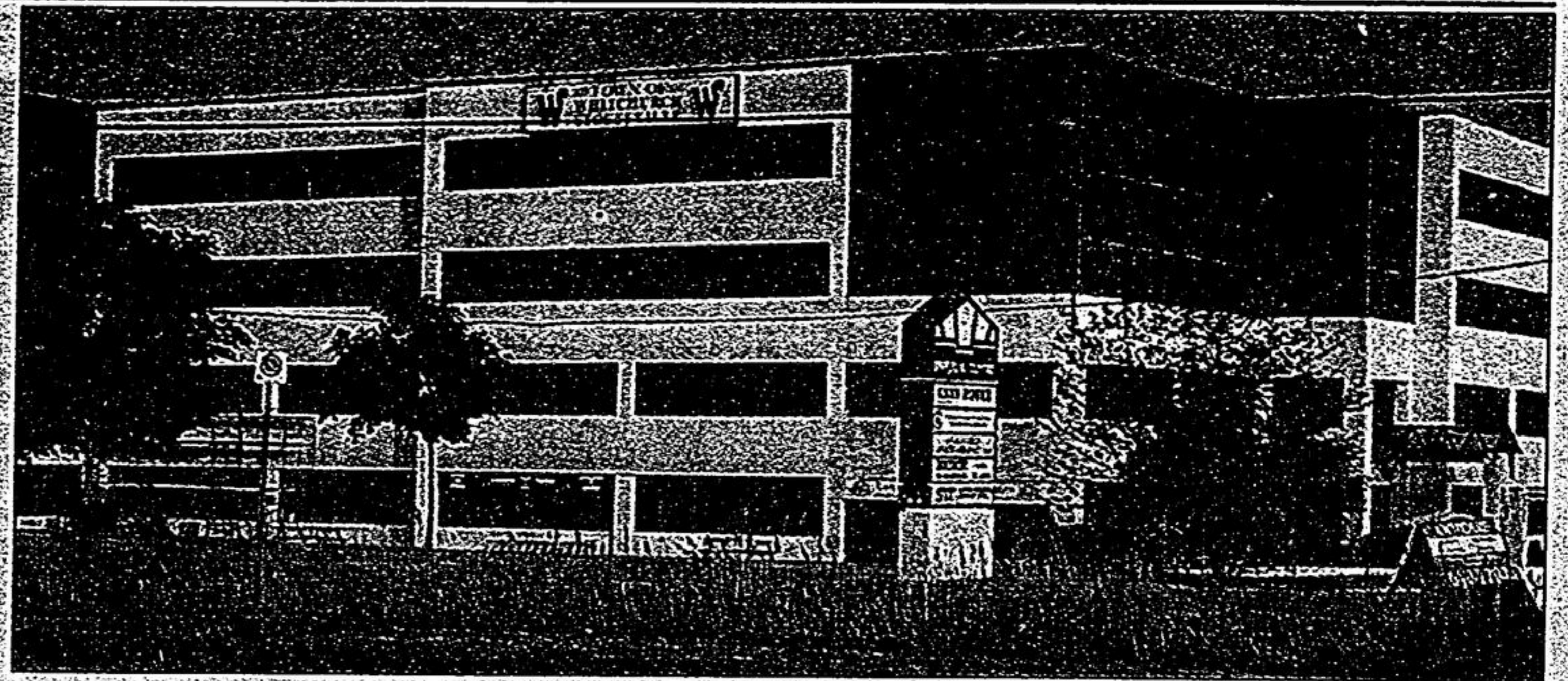

Demand for offices led to \$3M expansion

About \$3 million and a year later, the enlarged Imperial Centre at Main Street and Sandiford Drive officially opened for business last Friday.

The size of the building increased by about one-third and so did the number of employees. Of the 300 or so people working in the building, more than 70 per cent come from Whitchurch-Stouffville, building owner Louie Kojancic said.

He began the addition to the building last year in May in response to demand for more office space in Stouffville.

None of the new tenants came from Stouffville's downtown core, Mr. Kojancic noted.

The municipal offices grew to 22,000 square feet, allowing all departments to

be together on the fourth floor.

The increased space came just in the nick of time for the town, which is in the process of hiring additional staff, including two planners, a deputy clerk and manager of finance among others, to keep up with the municipality's burgeoning growth.

The enlarged building "has been a bonus for us," said Mayor Sue Sherban, who cut the ribbon at the official opening last Friday.

After several years' absence, the building will again have a cafe — in the new addition. The Imperial Cafe will open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., serving a variety of foods, including Macedonian specialties by cafe owner Vera Belchevski.

The parking lot for the largest office building in Stouffville can accommodate 300 vehicles.
