

Notice to Hydro One Customers Planned Power Interruption

Where: Parts of Whitchurch-Stouffville and Uxbridge Township
When: Sunday June 11, midnight until 8 a.m.

In the early hours of June 11, electrical supply will be interrupted for Hydro One customers in parts of Whitchurch-Stouffville and the Township of Uxbridge. The area to be affected is bounded roughly by the 404 to the west, Uxbridge 6th Concession to the east, Bloomington Road to the south, and Sandford Road to the north. Hydro One has left telephone messages for customers whose service will be interrupted.

This power interruption is required to ensure a safe working environment for Hydro One workers as they relocate hydro poles and power lines in the Town of Newmarket to facilitate local road improvements.

Hydro One has planned this outage during the night to minimize disruption, and is working closely with police to ensure public safety at major intersections where traffic signals will be affected.

SAFETY RECALL MASTERCRAFT MITRE SAW, MITRE SAW WITH LASER LINE AND MITRE SAW WITH STAND

Canadian Tire is voluntarily recalling two Mastercraft 10" Compound Mitre Saws, two Mastercraft 10" Compound Mitre Saws with Laser Line and Mastercraft 10" Compound Mitre Saw with Stand (Canadian Tire product numbers 55-6802, 55-6895, 55-6893, 55-6821 and 99-7599) due to a potential safety concern. It has been determined that due to a manufacturing defect, the aluminium cast pivot joint that connects the base of the saw and the head assembly (containing the blade) may crack under extreme pressure or force causing a potential safety concern.

While Canadian Tire is not aware of any incidents causing injury, there have been 13 in which the aluminium cast joint pivot cracked. In four of these instances, the pivot head broke causing the head to detach from the base.

Canadian Tire is asking customers to discontinue the use of these products immediately and to return the products to Canadian Tire for a refund.

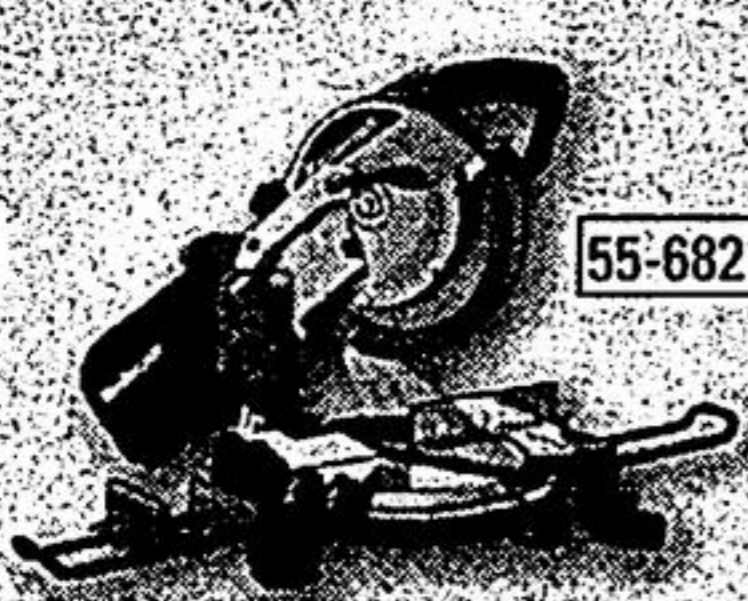

How the unit can be identified:

The saws contain a Blue label on the motor housing of the units. Products included in this recall will have one of five Canadian Tire product numbers: 55-6802, 55-6895, 55-6893, 55-6821 or 99-7599, followed by a serial number that begins with the letter 'W' (highlighted in White or Yellow). Only those saws containing one of the five product numbers, as well as the letter 'W' are included in this recall.

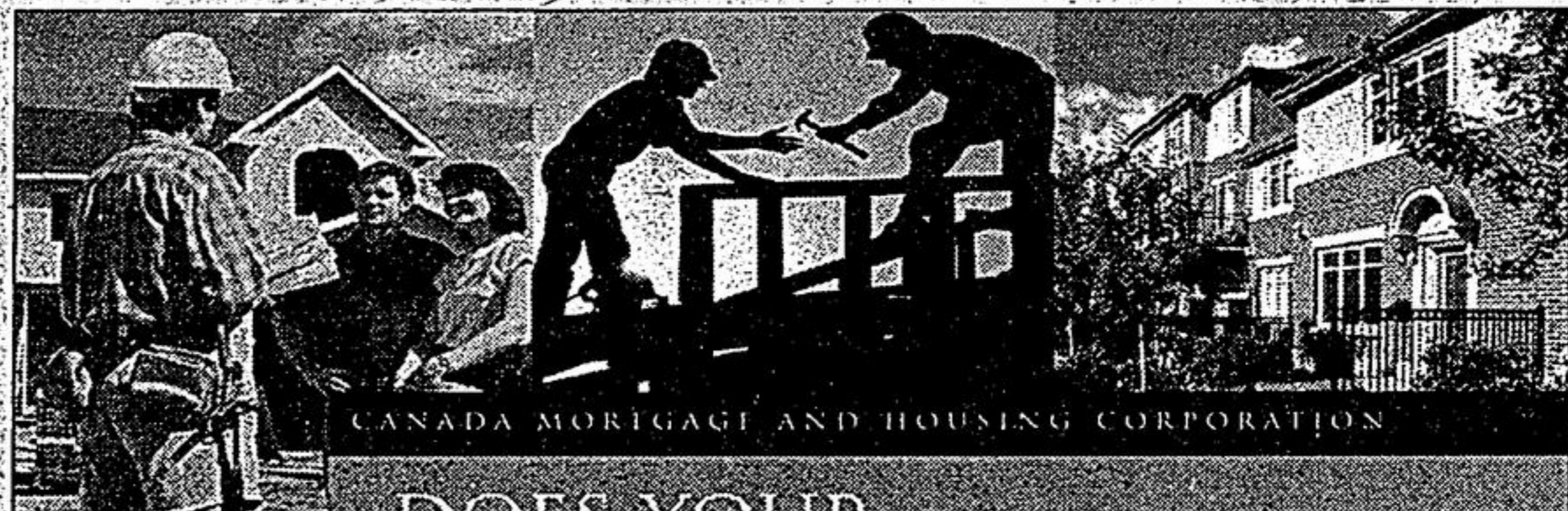

REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS
Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program (RRAP)

Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) is providing an opportunity for landlords in Ontario under the Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program (RRAP).

Limited funds are available in 2006 to repair or rehabilitate a rental or rooming house property to a minimum level of health and safety or to convert non-residential properties into affordable rental or rooming house accommodations.

Landlords must submit applications by 4:30 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time, July 7, 2006. Applications received after this time will not be considered.

Homeowners and private entrepreneurs owning existing family residential properties in Ontario may also apply for RRAP funding to create secondary suites or garden suites for low-income seniors or disabled adults. The secondary/garden suites deadline may be extended depending on number of proposals received.

Please note: Application submission does not guarantee financial assistance. Funding expires March 31, 2007. Funding is available for "Off Reserve" properties only. Work started before loan approval is not eligible for funding.
