COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

REDEVELOPMENT OF 19 CIVIC AVENUE "NINETEEN ON THE PARK"

Council unanimously approved a preliminary business case for the redevelopment of 19 Civic Avenue. "Nineteen on the Park" will be used as a flexible programming space for the arts, cultural and entertainment sectors and will serve as an exciting catalyst for downtown revitalization.

A project implementation team co-chaired by the Mayor and CAO will be formed to oversee the building's implementation, fundraising and grants. Following construction and start up, the facility will be operated as a Board of Management of the Town. The steps include Council's review of project implementation details, consultant retention and financing plan approval.

DOWNTOWN STOUFFVILLE PARKING AND CIRCULATION STUDY

Council received the Stouffville Parking and Circulation Study, an important document setting out a detailed analysis and a number of recommendations intended to improve parking and traffic circulation in the downtown. A final draft of the study and its outcomes will be prepared for Council's review in the future, following consultation with the Business Improvement Area, Downtown Stouffville Working Group and downtown property owners.

PARK DRIVE EXTENSION

NOTICE WATER BILLS - DUE DATE - JUNE 23, 2006

WATER bills have now been mailed. For those who have not received their bills should contact the Municipal Water Department as soon as possible. Failure to receive a water bill does not eliminate the responsibility for payment of water or the penalty charges for late payment.

WATER PAYMENTS may be made by mail, at most Financial Institutions, banking machines, by telephone and internet or in person at the Town Office, 37 Sandiford Drive, 4th Floor. After hours, water payments may be made in the drop box at the front west entrance door of the Imperial Building (37 Sandiford Drive).

OUTDOOR WATER USE FOR THE COMMUNITIES OF STOUFFVILLE, BALLANTRAE AND MUSSELMAN LAKE WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM

No person shall use the municipal water of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville from a hose, pipe, sprinkler or permanent water irrigation system for the purpose of watering any lawn, garden or the washing of vehicles, sidewalks or driveways or the filling of swimming pools except as follows:

An EVEN numbered address may use water outdoors ONLY ON EVEN NUMBERED DAYS of the month;

An ODD numbered address may use water outdoors ONLY ON ODD NUMBERED DAYS of the month;

Outdoor water use is only permitted between the hours of 6:00 am to 10:00 am and 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm. This use of municipal water from a hose, pipe, sprinkler or permanent water irrigation system outside these periods is a contravention of the by-law.

That these conditions be in place between May 15th and September 30th of each year.

Exemptions to the above are provided in Schedule A.
