At the same time, he is looking forward to working with the new staff and is optimistic each member can help the club improve on last season's dismal performance.

"There's a role each one of us (assistant coaches) takes on and I think we will be a close staff and have insights on different perspectives of the game," he said. "I think we will be a good group here and we're looking forward to being successful. As assistant coaches, we are extensions of the head coach."

Having been an assistant coach for the last 10 seasons, including six with the Leafs, two with the New York Rangers and four with the Philadelphia Flyers, Acton is quite happy to remain in his present capacity and is focused on the challenge of trying to bring the Stanley Cup back to Toronto. Being a head coach isn't in his plans for the time being.

"I really enjoy the role I'm in now and thrilled to be with the Leafs. Individually, we all have aspirations and expectations of ourselves. For the time being I'm content at doing what I'm doing and to help the Leafs be successful," he said.

Silver lining for Geiger

Natalie Geiger claimed a pair of silver medals last weekend at the Canadian Junior Track and Field Championships in Sherbrooke, Que.

Entering Grade 11 this fall at Stouffville District Secondary School, the 15-year-old Stouffville resident finished second in the 200m and 400m.

A member of the York Flyers Track Club, Geiger was timed in 24.71 seconds in the 200m and was just .40 seconds behind Kimberly Hyacinthe of Saint-Lauren, Que.

Timed in 55.12 in the 400m, Geiger was just .93 seconds behind winner Caroline Muir of the Etobicoke Gladstone Track Club.
