Gladioli sale helps fight epilepsy

The cheerful bunches of gladioli you'll see at the Stouffville Country Market Saturday are there to help people cope with epilepsy.

Epilepsy York Region continues a 15-year tradition by selling the blooms from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. during "Glad Days" to raise funds for its support and awareness programs.

Some local businesses have gotten involved by pre-ordering flowers. About 20 volunteers help sort, deliver and sell the flowers.

There is still a stigma attached to having epilepsy, Epilepsy York Region executive director Merrily Beauchamp noted, and many with epilepsy have difficulty finding jobs.

About two of every 100 people have epilepsy and about 10 per cent of the population will have a seizure sometime during their life.

Funds from the Glad Days campaign are used to raise public awareness by having speakers visit schools, service clubs and other groups. Epilepsy York Region also holds workshops and adult support groups.
