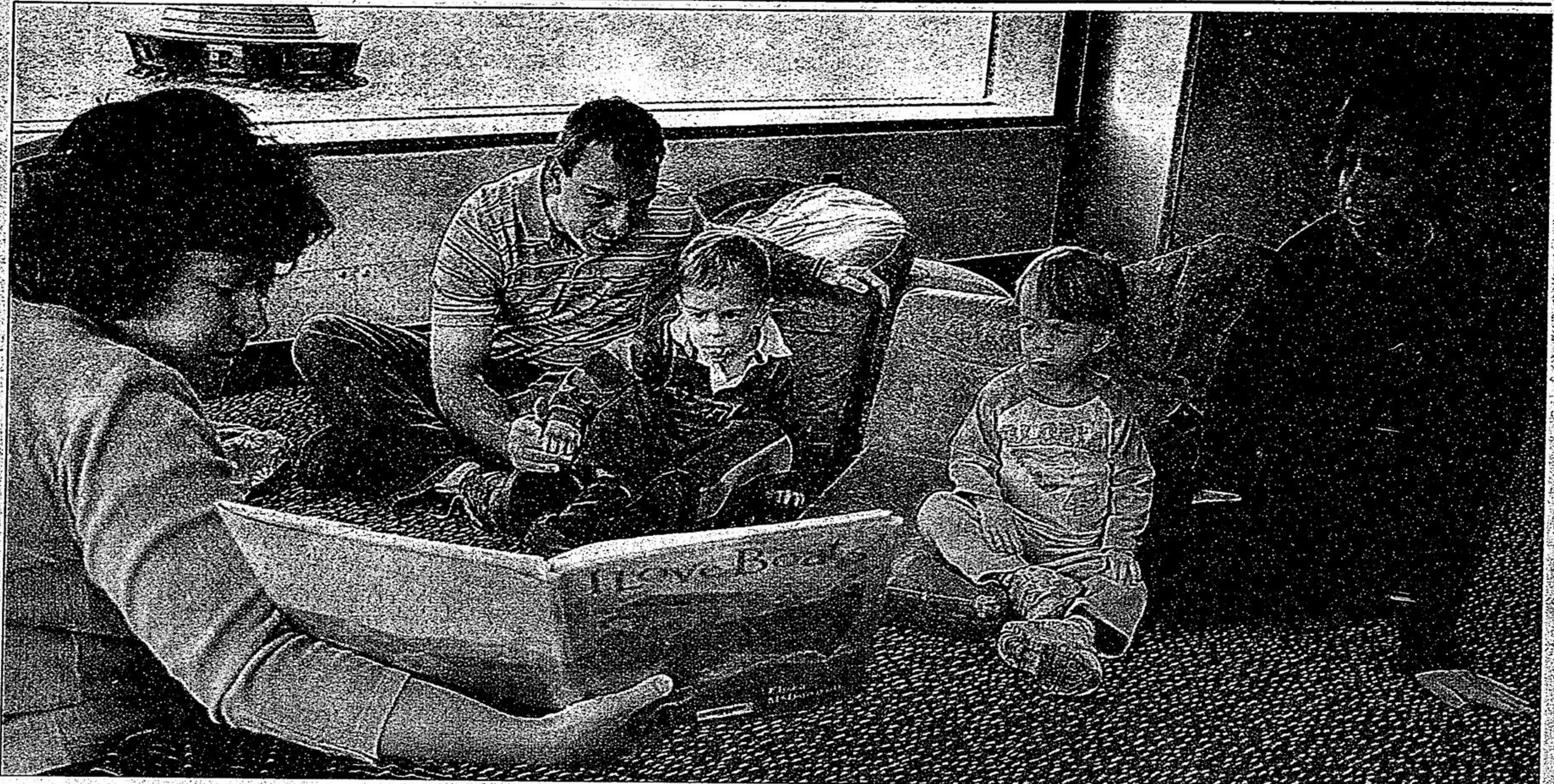

### Cost of dying going up

Fees for interments, burials and other costs associated with cemeteries could go up by five per cent in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

The fees apply to the Stouffville Cemetery, at Tenth Line and Main Street, which is the only cemetery where plots and cre-

mation niches are sold to the public.

No further plots are being sold at the municipality's other two cemeteries, Hartman Cemetery on Davis Drive and Bloomington Cemetery.

Council's recommendation to raise the fees has to be forwarded to the Ministry of Consumer and Business Services for approval.
