



hirings during budget presentations March 27.

The draft business plans and budgets should be available later this month.

Later, Mr. Emmerson said he wasn't "picking on" the former council. Many residents asked about the theatre, park, traffic, growth and taxes during the campaign. He shared his position on these key issues with the seniors.

Ask some hard questions when provincial candidates coming knocking at your doors in the next few months the mayor urged the seniors.

He's particularly concerned about pooling, in which 905 municipalities send money to Toronto to pay for social programs.

"They want \$95 million this year," he said. "(Municipalities) can't afford to send \$95 million to the City of Toronto with no input from them."

The decade-old debate about putting a theatre into the old town hall behind the Clock Tower will most likely find a resolution at a special council meeting Feb. 27.

"A few people want to preserve this building for an arts and cultural centre," Mr. Emmerson said. "I believe the former council has moved it too far to turn it back."

Mr. Emmerson wants a larger theatre at another location.

He also believes council should consider purchasing Stouffville District Secondary School to provide recreational facilities.

The town is in the process of severing land on the school property so if the school were sold, the track and road would remain with the town.

Signing a 10-year garbage and recycling contract also doesn't sit well with the mayor. He feels that's too long a time that council essentially has no control over the service.
