

# Coach's suspension appealed

The Markham Waxers' Provincial Junior A Hockey League season officially ended March 4 when they were eliminated in seven games by the St. Michael's Buzzers.

But they aren't going down without a fight.

During game six of the series March 3 at Centennial Arena, which the Buzzers won 5-2, Waxers assistant coach and Jeff Perrin had questioned the work of referee Ross Bain by talking with a referee supervisor who was in attendance.

Perrin, a former Stouffville Spirit assistant coach, is a Ballantrae-area resident.

During the contest, the Waxers thought Bain refused to call some dives by the Buzzers, while their own players

were penalized. The Buzzers scored four power-play goals.

Perrin was given a one-year suspension for his actions and the Waxers were fined \$1,000 by the league.

Joe Cornacchia, Waxers general manager, thought the league was too harsh.

"I feel for the league to suspend Jeff for one year and the fine with no hearing was unfair," he said.

"There have been other people who have done worse in the league than what Jeff did and didn't get that lengthy a suspension."

The Waxers have appealed the ruling with the Ontario Hockey Association.

OHA president Brent Ladds expects a hearing will take place this month.

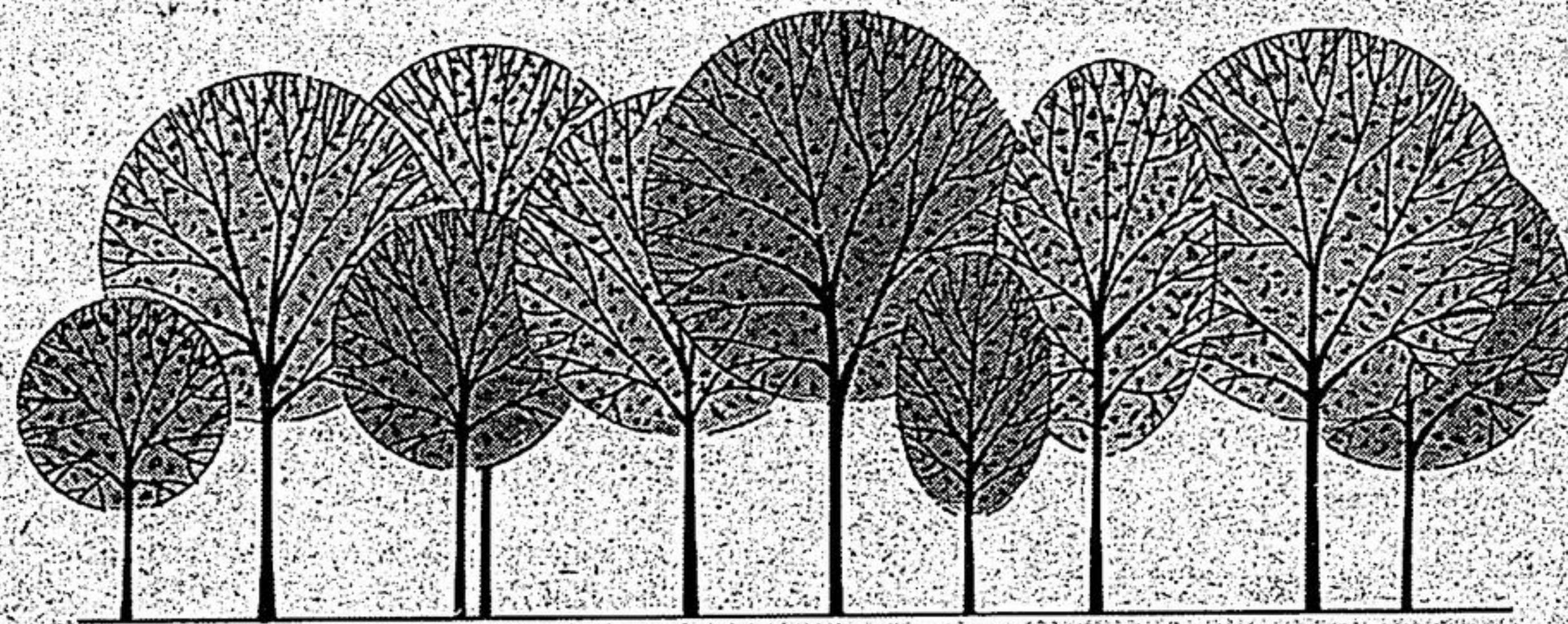

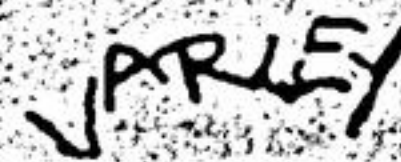
