Choirs sounded golden at festival

Four choruses from Whitchurch-Stouffville sang their way to gold Monday at York Region's Music Alive festival.

Three of the choirs were comprised of young people who had performed in musical theatre productions of the York Durham Academy for Performing Arts. The other was the Ballantrae Community Choir, whose members live in the Ballantrae Golf and Country Club subdivision.

Around 20 Munchkins directed by Neil Bennett, made the music of The Wizard of Oz come to life; the chorus from Oliver was directed by YDAPA founder Wayne Hill and Natalie Wu directed the young singers from The Jungle Book production.

The groups don't compete against each other, but rather are judged according to specific standards.

In previous years, YDAPA's children's chorus and band also achieved gold standing.

The Ballantrae choir, of about 20 members, also hit the right notes according to the adjudicators.

The choir was directed by Wayne Hill. Adjudicators chose a number of Stouffville performers from the thousands who competed during the festival to perform at Wednesday night's closing ceremonies at Newmarket Theatre.

The six-week festival, presented annually by Artslink, drew about 13,000 participants in 660 categories this year.

They included the primary choir from Whitchurch Highlands Public School directed by Brenda Amelard and YDAPA's Munchkins.

Stouffville resident Caelyn Hill played a flute duet with Markham's Cealidh Stringer and Holly Barker from the Stouffville Christian School performed a vocal solo.
