- A perennial favourite, which usually involves some crying, is the baby contest running from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. in the Franklin Park Marquee. Please arrive at 10 a.m. for registration. The baby contest is hosted by the Children's House Childcare Centre and is sponsored by Tim Hortons. Baby contest registration forms are available on the strawberry-festival.ca website.

- At 2 p.m. on Strawberry Festival Saturday, bring your whistling skills to the Franklin Park Marquee. Local whistler Stephen Sword and as many people as

On Strawberry Festival Sunday, in the Kids Zone, there's a bubble gum blowing contest from 1 to 1:30 p.m. in the Memorial park Creek tent.

The other contest on Sunday is for canine residents. The fun dog contest starts at 2 p.m. in Franklin Park.

The Strawberry Festival runs from June 27 (starting with the Strawberry Festival Music Concert at Stouffville United Church at 8 p.m.) until July 1.
