# Sisters' pageant entries are charitable acts

Sisters Bianca and Sonia Mondino are hosting a dinner gala Sunday night in Stouffville.

Two Markham sisters are hoping to bring home tiaras and scholarships from the Miss Canada Pageant and raise some money for three charities at a Stouffville event.

Bianca Mondino, 19, is representing Markham in the Miss Canada International Achievement Pageant, while her sister, Sonia, who turns 16 in August, is entering the 2008 Miss Teen Canada International Achievement Pageant.

The pageants, which are at the Mississauga Living Arts Centre Aug. 18, focus on candidates' personalities, intellect, public speaking abilities and charity involvement.

Bianca entered the pageant to reach out to the community, she said. She looks forward to meeting the other delegates from across Canada.

Entering her third year at the University of Toronto, Bianca has volunteered at her school as an orientation leader, helping new students become acclimatized to university life. She wants to encourage young people to volunteer more in their communities.

Sonia is going into Grade 11 at St. Augustine Catholic High

School this September. The young women are holding a dinner gala called *Paradiso: An evening in the Tropics* on Sunday at Latham Hall in Stouffville.

The event runs from 5:30 to 11 p.m. and will raise funds and awareness for three charities: the Multiple Hereditary Exostoses (MHE) Research Foundation, of which Bianca is ambassador, the Dove Self-Esteem Fund and Kids Help Phone, which Sonia is supporting.

Bianca supports the MHE Research Foundation after battling the rare condition, which causes the growth of bone tumours, when she was seven. She had to undergo an operation to alleviate the pain and allow her to walk better. People with the condition also suffer from chronic fatigue.

She is supporting the Dove Self-Esteem Fund to promote a more inclusive definition of beauty among young women.

The Kids Self-Help Phone Line provides counselling and education for children and youth and can refer them to appropriate agencies and shelters.

### CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT TENTH LINE WIDENING AND RECONSTRUCTION

#### THE STUDY

The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for the widening and reconstruction of Tenth Line from the south Town boundary to Forsyth Farm Road, north of Main Street. The project is required to address traffic congestion, pedestrian safety, and other transportation issues as growth continues in the Town proximate to the Study Area.

#### THE PROCESS

This project is being undertaken as a Schedule C project pursuant to the Municipal Engineers Association's Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document (June 2000).

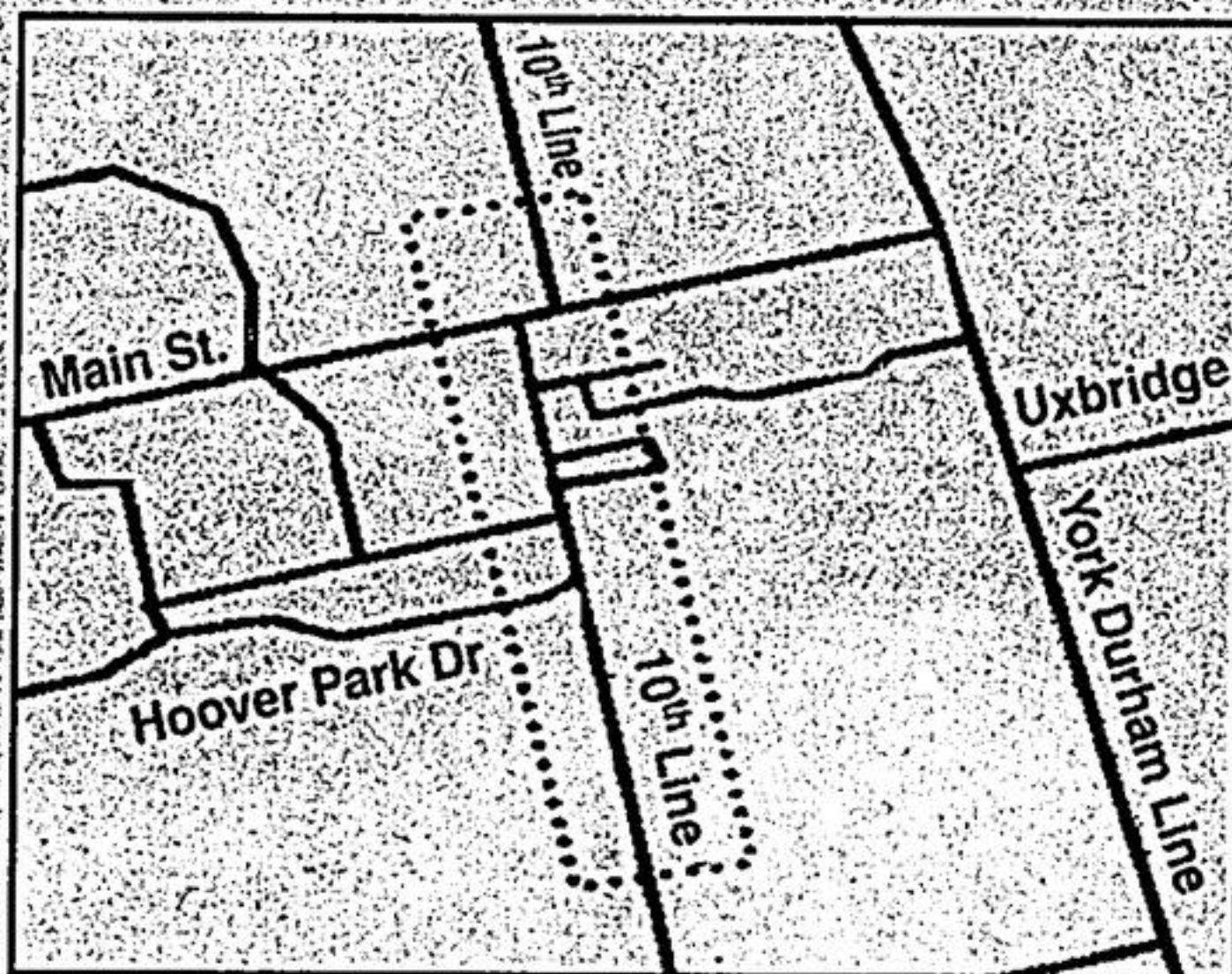
The Class EA process requires public and review agency consultation, an evaluation of alternative solutions, an assessment of the impacts of the alternatives, and identification of measures to mitigate any adverse impacts. As part of the Study, Public Information Centres will be held in Fall 2007 to provide background information on the study and the various alternatives considered, including a comparative analysis of those alternatives. Representatives from the Town and the project consultants, Totten Sims Hubicki Associates, will be present at the Public Information Centres to answer questions and discuss the next steps in the study. Additional notification of the Public Information Centre will be provided.

Upon completion of the study, an Environmental Study Report will be available for public review and comment. Another advertisement will be published at that time.
