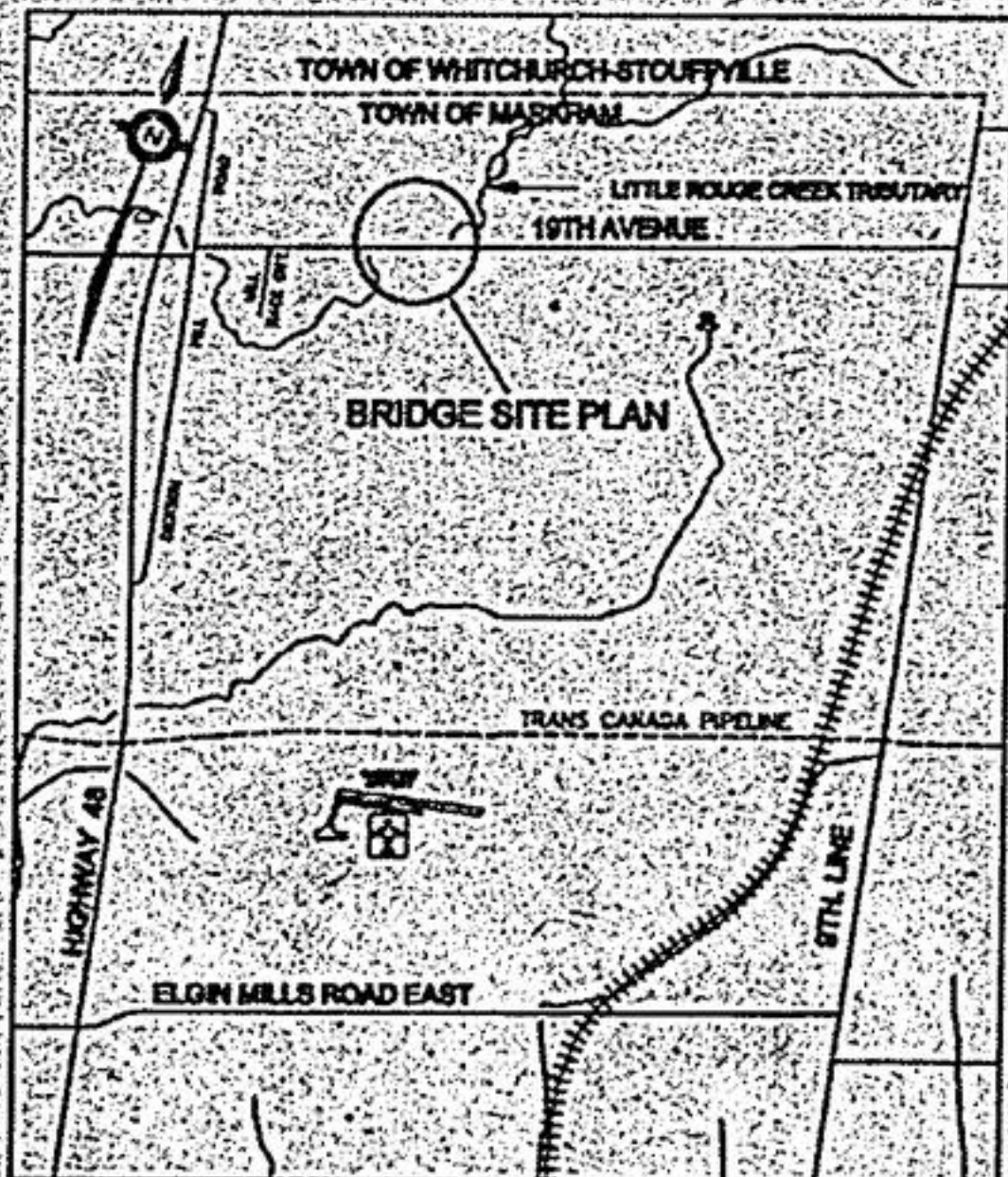

NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE

19TH AVENUE BRIDGE REPLACEMENT OVER THE EAST TRIBUTARY OF THE LITTLE ROUGE CREEK

The Town of Markham has retained Totten Sims Hubicki Associates (TSH) to undertake the design of the replacement of the bridge on 19th Avenue over the East Tributary of the Little Rouge Creek between Highway 48 and 9th Line. The location of the bridge is shown on the Key Plan.

Replacement of the bridge is required due to its deteriorated condition and deficient width. Replacement of the bridge would improve safety by increasing the width of the deck to the current standard for a two-lane roadway. As part of the process, TSH has reviewed alternatives to the undertaking and developed a feasible strategy for the removal and replacement of the existing bridge.

An informal drop-in style Public Information Centre will be held to allow the public an opportunity to review design drawings and other study material and to discuss the project with the design team. You are invited to attend the Public Information Centre on:

Tuesday, August 14, 6 p.m. to 9 p.m.

Victoria Square Community Centre, 2929 Elgin Mills Road East (south side, just west of Woodbine Avenue)

This project follows the approved environmental planning process for Schedule "B" projects under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Process (June 2000), with the opportunity for public input throughout. There is opportunity at any time during the environmental assessment process for interested persons to provide comments and request a review of outstanding issues. If however, after participating in this project, you continue to have serious concerns, you have the right to request that the Minister of the Environment reclassify (or bump-up) this project to a Schedule "C" project or to an individual environmental assessment.
