Hulk shoots tomorrow

You're in Hollywood North this week.

The *Incredible Hulk* is being filmed tomorrow at a LeFarge Gravel Pit in the eastern Whitchurch-Stouffville.

Filming is also being done in Toronto, New York City and Brazil. It stars Edward Norton, Liv Tyler and William Hurt and will be in theatres in June.

The TV movie *The Russell Girl* was shot in Memorial Park and locations along Main Street this week.

About three or four films are shot in Whitchurch-Stouffville each year, town CAO Dave Cash said.

Filmmakers have to apply for a permit, with a \$275 fee. If roads are used and closed up for any length of time, that's another \$275. Security deposits are required.

For *The Russell Girl*, the town received \$800 in fees plus another \$200 for renting the ball diamond. Russell Films Inc. also made a \$2,000 donation to the Stouffville Business Improvement Area.

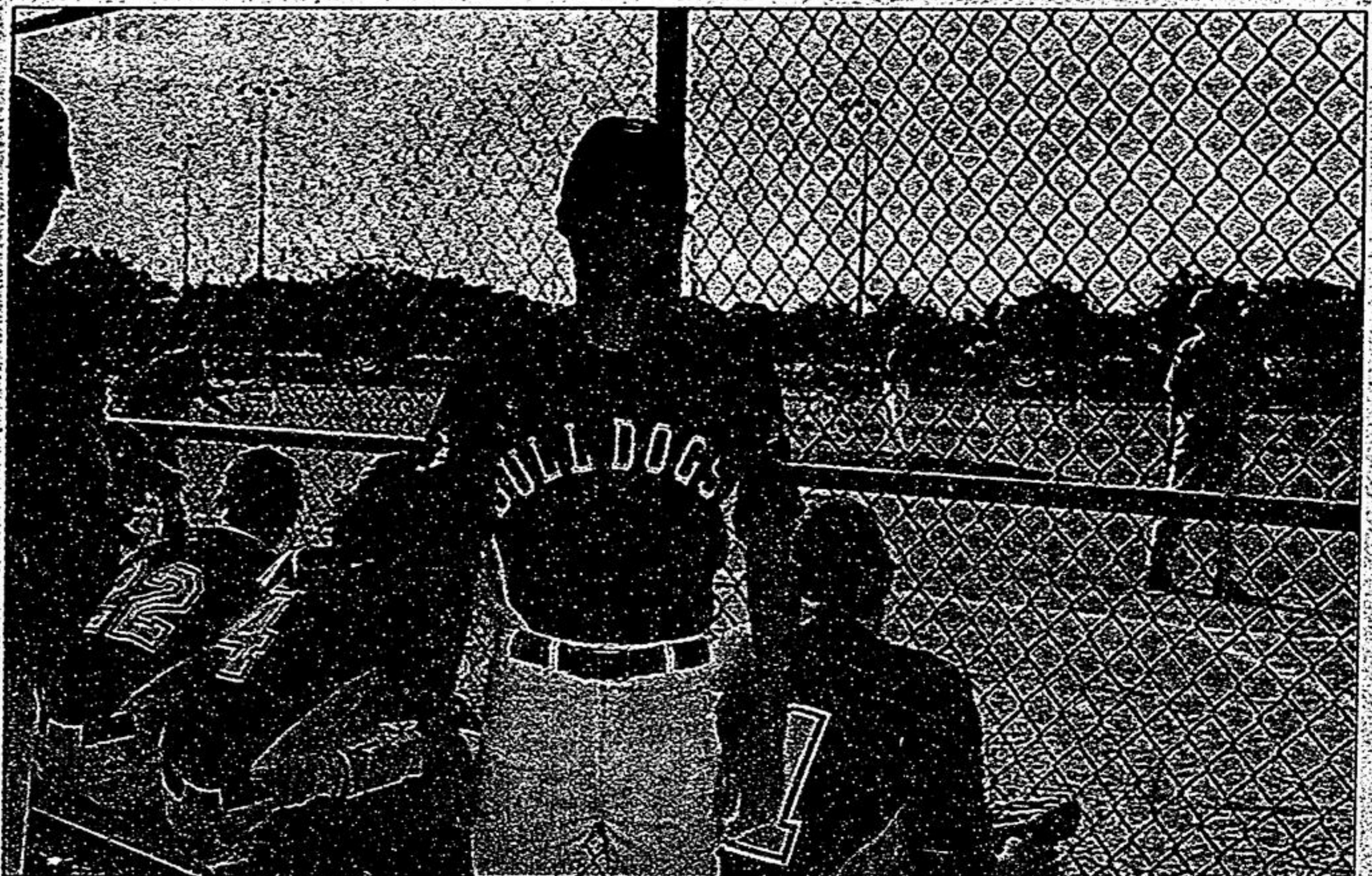

Phil Russell, the parents of Sarah Russell. Paul Wesley (Law and Order and CSI) plays Evan, Amber's boyfriend.

During filming Monday morning, the Bulldogs baseball team in its red and white uniforms played rivals The Panthers in Memorial Park. The Bulldogs were made up of 30 players from house and rep leagues in the Markham District Baseball Association, plus Ben Lewis.

Association president Fred Mellor plays the umpire in the film.

Along Main Street, new businesses could be seen including an antique store (Reid's Antiques and Consignments), Maisers Pharmacy (The Healing Force), a new elegant coffee shop (Candlelight and Memories) and a new decorating place called the Colour Gallery, formerly known as Inside Out Decorating. Stouffville Monument Works Ltd. was turned into a hardware store, on the outside at least.

The Terry Fox Run banner over Main was replaced by a sign urging the fictitious Bulldogs to beat the Panthers. Vehicles with Illinois plates rolled by USA Today newspaper boxes and U.S. Postal Service mail boxes.

At The Healing Force, owner Suze Joyce watched as the store was transformed into the local pharmacy where Ms. Tamblyn's character goes to buy ibuprofen.

At Candlelight and Memories, the cosy tea shop was changed into an upscale coffee shop, complete with outdoor tables and umbrellas. Extras sipped their lattes while a scene with the main character was filmed.

Pat Montgomery, owner of Candlelight and Memories, felt it was an honour that her building was used in the movie. Crew members and actors were at her shop all day Monday.

Watching some of the action from in front of her Stouffville Furniture store, Villi Papas said, "It is wonderful. It puts Stouffville on the map."

Residents stopped to watch the filming, with York Regional Police providing security.

STOPPING TRAFFIC

Some drivers were inconvenienced as traffic was stopped briefly along Main Street and at the Lebovic Centre during filming.

A restaurant owner saw his business drop Monday because most of the parking spots were used by the film company's trucks and equipment.



The town, particularly the leisure services department, was very helpful during the filming process, assistant location manager Jeff Nelson, of Russell Films Inc., said.

He finds about 95 per cent of people are very positive about the filming experience.

The downtown Stouffville/ Illinois fantasy didn't last, however.

Wednesday morning, everything was back to normal as the film crew took their trucks, equipment and headsets to downtown Toronto to film more scenes at De La Salle College, a Roman Catholic preparatory school.
