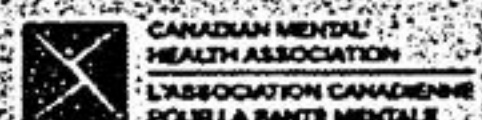

Do you need answers to election question?

Rotary Club hosts meeting on Oct. 10 referendum

Do you know what the Oct. 10 referendum question is?

It appears many people are still unclear about what they have a right to vote for in the referendum and that their decision will affect the electoral process in the future.

That's why the Stouffville Rotary Club has invited referendum resource officer Denyse Lynch to answer residents' questions Sept. 27.

Referendum officers are visiting community service groups, organizations, community fairs and festivals around Ontario to let people know more about the referendum.

'DO YOUR HOMEWORK'

"Everybody has to do their homework to make an informed decision," Ms Lynch said.

The referendum presents voters with two choices: to keep the electoral process the same or change to mixed member proportional.

Under the current process, the candidate who receives the most votes wins a seat in the provincial legislature and the party that wins in the most

ridings is normally asked to form the government.

Under the mixed member proportional system, you get two votes. They vote for their local member of provincial parliament and also for the political party of their choice.

VOTE FOR PARTY AND MPP

The local members would fill 90 seats, while so-called list members fill 39 seats. The political party with the largest number of seats in the legislature, from a combination of local and list members, would be form the new government.

The votes for the political parties would be used to determine the number of list members each party gets.

If a political party is entitled to more seats than it won locally, list members are elected to make up the difference.

This means a political party's overall share of seats will be approximately equal to its share of the total votes for the parties.

"List members represent all the voters in Ontario who voted for that political party," Ms Lynch said.

The public information meeting is at Christ Church Anglican, 254 Sunset Blvd., at 7:30 p.m.
