

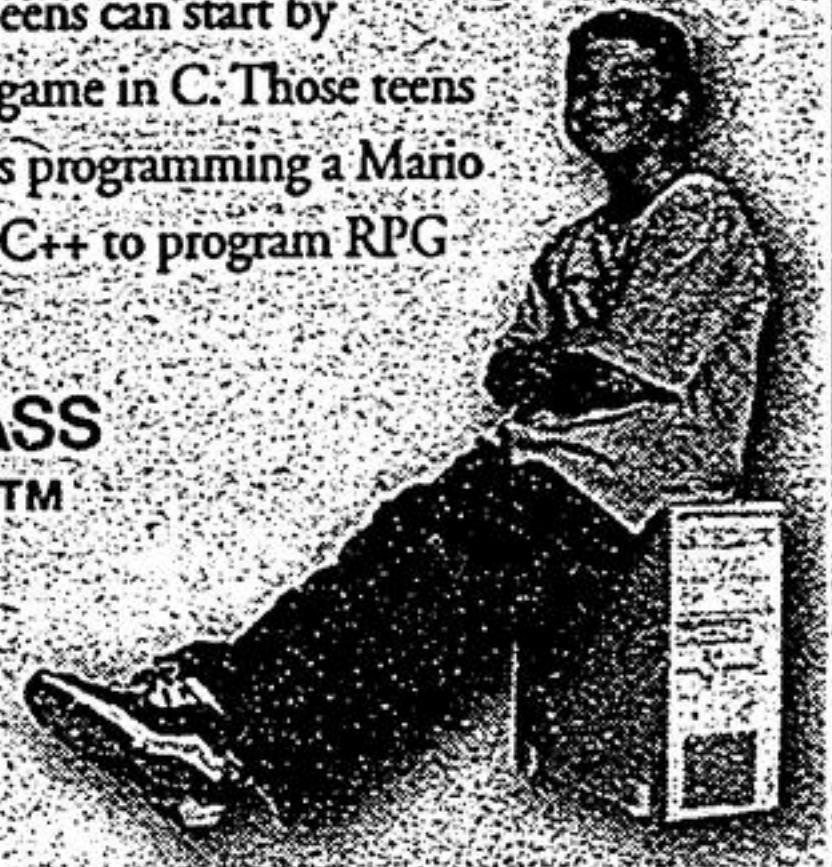
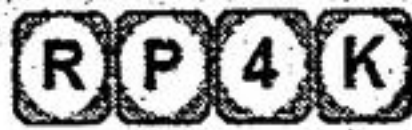
"Mom, I want to LEARN GAME PROGRAMMING"

Police gobble of speeders in Thanksgiving blitz

Hundreds of drivers will be reminded of the Thanksgiving weekend by the charges they face for driving aggressively.

Between Friday and Monday, York Regional Police laid 751 charges for speeding, racing and driving 50 km/h over the limit, seatbelt violations and other offences.

The charges break down as follows:

- Speeding: 404
- Seatbelts: 58
- Racing/speeding 50 km-h over the

limit: 5

• Other: 284

Charges for driving 50 km-h or more over the limit were laid in Markham and Vaughan, traffic Sgt. Bradley Bulmer said.

"People need to understand the legislation that gives police the power to impound vehicles being driven at such speeds leaves police with no other option," Sgt. Bulmer said.

"It's not that we may impound your car, we will impound your car," he said.

In light of the nearly 60 seat-belt charges, police are reminding you the buckles are there for your safety.

In a 50 km-h collision, someone will strike the interior of their vehicle with the same force as falling from a three-storey building, Sgt. Bulmer said.

Patrol officers also charged 14 motorists with impaired driving — eight of whom were spotted by people who called 911 to report them, police said.

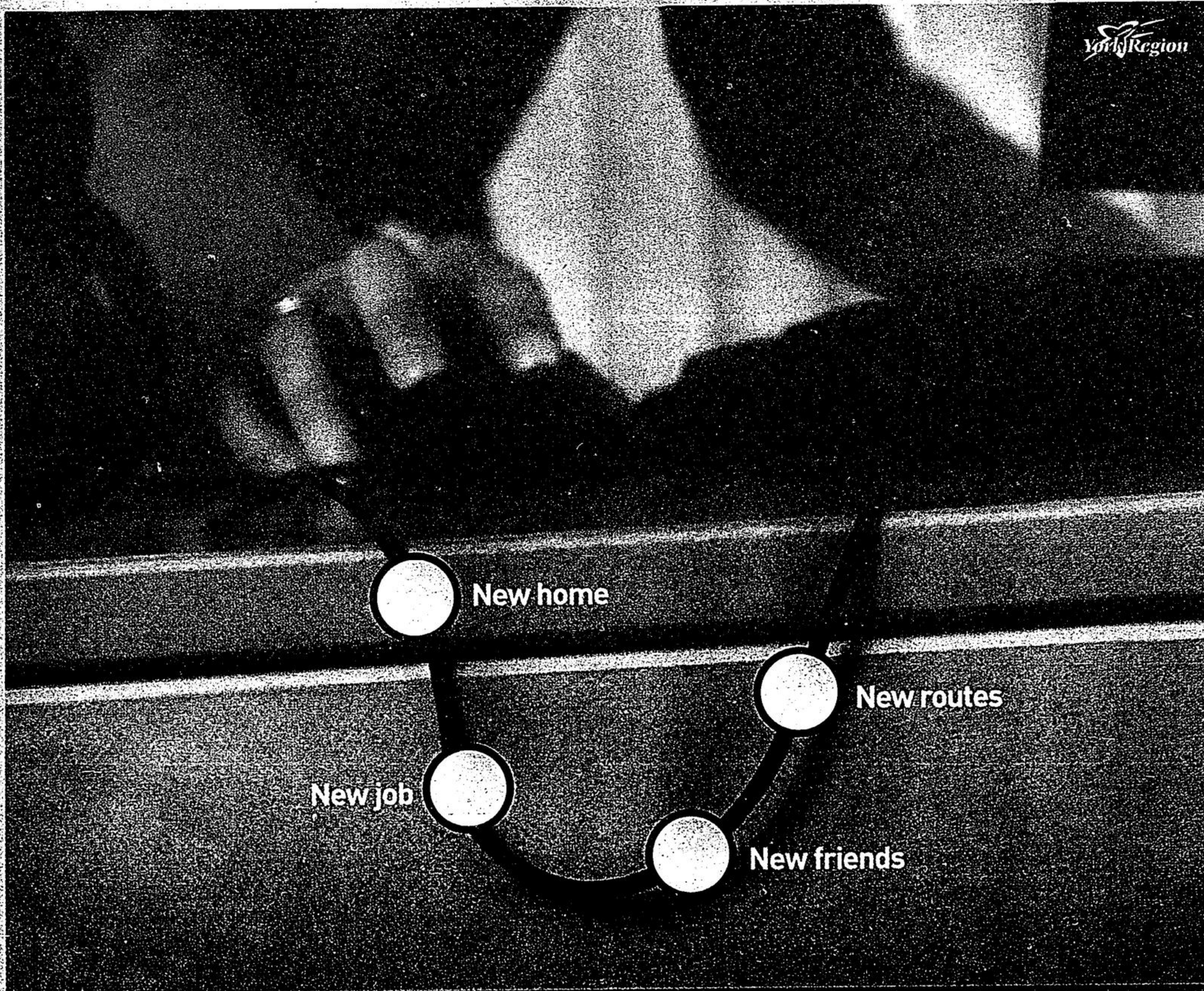
During one bust Friday, a man was spotted driving erratically before hitting other vehicles in a Newmarket beer store lot.

After calling 911, other motorists prevented the man from leaving before police arrived.

Ontario Provincial Police impounded 175 vehicles as well over the weekend.

On Friday afternoon, a motorcyclist was caught travelling at 210 km-h on Hwy. 400.

The biker allegedly passed an OPP officer at 180 km-h and then sped up when he was chased. He later smashed into a cruiser at the Hwy. 7 exit and now faces several charges. His motorcycle and licence were seized.
