Police are urging people to keep doors and windows locked, make sure their homes have proper lighting, know who is at the door before opening it and report suspicious people to the authorities.

Both suspects are described as male, of Hispanic descent between 20 and 25-year-old, Det.-Sgt. Wassink said.

One suspect stands about five-feet five-inches tall with a slim build, was wearing a baseball cap, a light-coloured jacket or hoodie and a T-shirt.

The other suspect stands about six-feet tall with a heavier build.

PEDESTRIAN & CYCLING MASTER PLAN STUDY

NOTICE OF OPEN HOUSE NO. 3

The Regional Municipality of York is nearing completion of a study to develop a Regional Pedestrian & Cycling Master Plan. This study is investigating how York Region can work with local municipalities to connect local pedestrian and cycling systems into a regional-scale network, improve connections to transit nodes and encourage the combining of walking and cycling trips with public transit.

The study team has consulted extensively with residents of York Region, staff from all nine local municipalities and the two conservation authorities in the Region as well as staff from adjacent municipalities, area cycling clubs, and other stakeholders. A Public Advisory Committee (PAC) consisting of representatives from each municipality in York Region was established at the outset of the study and has provided valuable input into the development of this draft Master Plan. In addition, two rounds of Open Houses were conducted in May 2006 and again in October 2006 at key stages of the study to provide the public with the opportunity to review and provide input and meet with the study team.

The study is now nearing the end of its third and final phase. The study team has prepared and submitted to staff at York Region and local municipalities the draft York Region Pedestrian and Cycling Master Plan Study Report for review.

We invite you attend our third Open House to review a summary of the findings and recommendations of the draft Master Plan; talk with the study team and provide your comments on the recommended network route maps and other information prepared as part of this study. The Open House will be held on the following two dates and locations and has been designed for residents to drop in any time between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. to view display material and to ask questions or provide input to members of the study team.
