

# Special night in Spiritland

*Goalie blanks Seguin; unbeaten Newmarket visits Stouffville tonight*

For the Stouffville Spirit, a 7-0 victory over the visiting Seguin Bruins Thursday was a special night in more ways than one.

For starters, the Spirit's special teams unit came out smoking with two power-play goals and two shorthanded markers.

But for netminder Trevor O'Neill, it was a special occasion, as he recorded his first shutout as a member of the Spirit since joining the Provincial Junior A Hockey League club last season after being with the Markham Waxers.

"Trevor was solid," Spirit head coach Dave D'Amazio said of his netminder's performance as he handled 20 shots.

Mark Sullivan opened the scoring in the first period with a power-play goal. The Spirit then received a shorthanded marker from James McIntosh to take a 2-0 advantage through 20 minutes.

Ethan Werek opened the scoring early in the second period with a power-play marker. Just 19 seconds later, Darren Archibald scored the first of his two goals to pad the Spirit lead to 4-0. Archibald's second marker, a shorthanded tally, staked Stouffville to a 5-0

lead before Craig McDowell notched the first of his two goals to give the Spirit a commanding 6-0 advantage through two periods.

McDowell, a Stouffville resident, scored the lone goal of the third period.

"We found the back of the net a few times and that made things easy," D'Amazio said. "But I thought we cleaned up a few things in our game, our puck movement and play away from the puck was good."

Also bringing a smile to the Spirit was the return of five-year forward and captain Randy Johnston from a tryout with Charlotte of the East Coast Hockey League.

"He (Johnston) had a great experience there (in Charlotte)," D'Amazio said. "He went there for the experience and he chose to return to continue his hockey and education at the CIS level."

The Spirit's North Conference record improved to 5-4-2.

After playing in Collingwood last night, they host the North Conference-leading and unbeaten Newmarket Hurricanes today at 7:30 p.m. Newmarket is the fourth-ranked team in the country, one spot behind the Markham Waxers.

"(Thursday's win) was just one of three. We hope our last two games will generate some momentum," he said.


