Ethan Werek's national tour continues.

The Stouffville Spirit rookie forward will play for Ontario at the 2008 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge next month.

Team Ontario is one of five Canadian entries in the event, which will take place in London, Ont. Dec. 29 to Jan. 4, 2008. Other national team entries to take part include: Russia, the United States, Germany, Slovakia

and Finland. Team Ontario's first game is scheduled for Dec. 29 against Team Pacific (B.C.).

Werek, a 16-year-old Stouffville-area resident, played for Canada East at the World Junior 'A' Challenge in British Columbia, this month.

The Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association graduate will attend Boston University on scholarship starting in 2009.

In a return match against the Ajax Knights at the Stouffville Arena, the Clippers skated off with a 5-3 win.

Rintjema ignited the offence with four goals and one assist while Ferris had a goal and one helper. Meiliunas earned three assists and Laffey one.
