

Festive foods from the Greenbelt

No matter what celebration you take part in - Hanukkah, Christmas, Kwanzaa or another, the holiday season is here.

Although different in traditions, these holidays share a core meaning - love of family, community and of course, food.

"Food is one of the biggest things that connects us - socially, culturally and spiritually," says Iffat Zehra, Director of Community Economic Development for Immigrant Women, which creates social and economic opportunities for those in need. "The more ethnically diverse Ontario gets, the greater the demand for multicultural produce and ingredients to be included in these traditions."

Zehra's comments come days after the release of the 2006 Canadian census data showing the GTA as one of the most ethnically diverse areas in the World.

What better place to find this ethnically diverse produce than in the Greenbelt - 1.8 million acres of protected land surrounding the Golden Horseshoe. It includes over 7,000 farms protected from development and stretches from Niagara Falls to Tobermory to Peterborough. Greenbelt farmers produce over 100 varieties of vegetables, all types of meat, dairy products and fruits.

The Greenbelt is a leader in providing innovative ways to get old and new farmers planting more ethnic crops including programs like FarmStart and CRAFT.

Sweet potatoes for potato latkes, fruit preserves for pastries and vegetable combinations such as okra with black-eyed peas are all becoming more accessible through the Greenbelt.

Zehra is excited by the diversity of food out there. "With the amount of different crops available, it's becoming easier to fill our tables with the bounty of the Greenbelt."
