(continued from page 10) wears the traditional Tunker beard.

It was the Heise home, with its thick walls and tremendous door that sheltered either soldiers or people during the William Lyon Mackenzie rebellion. Since no one has ever kept track of the incident, it is told both ways, and sometimes is even said to have served as a fort against the Indians. The storekeeper, J. T. Johnson in New Gormley and Sam Doner in Old Gormley, are both members of the United Missionary, or Menonite Church. Mr. Johnson was born in England, came to Canada a Methodist, married a Menonite and when Union came decided to stick with his wife's church because it was more like the old Methodist one he had supported.

The other two premium alfalfas — Buffalo and Atlantic — also far outyield other varieties commonly grown in their areas of adaptability. Buffalo thrives best in 18 southern, southwestern and mid-western states. Atlantic is adapted for 11 eastern and southeastern states.
Kenland Red Clover is adapted for the southern part of the red clover belt which stretches from Minnesota to Virginia. It is strongly resistant to anthracnose, a disease that can damage and eventually kill most varieties of clover. Kenland's yields are higher than other types of clover when anthracnose is prevalent, and equally as high when it's not.
