
AGINCOURT BOY, 4 THIRD POLIO VICTIM

A bylaw prohibiting the renting of canoes to persons under 21 years of age was urged by Pickering Township Police Chief Lockhart Trinnell following a fatal canoe accident in the Rouge River recently.

Billy Dobson, 12, Kingston Rd., was drowned and his companion Gordon Grattan, 9, also of Kingston Rd. was saved when their canoe overturned.

"Canoes are upsetting all the time," complained Chief Trinnell. "It is a wonder there hasn't been more drownings."

. He said the section of the river in which the boy was drowned was running fast and the wind blowing. "It would have taken an expert

to keep a canoe upright in that water," he said.

The Grattan boy told police the canoe upset when "Billy stood up to swat a bird that went past."

"The canoe turned over and over and when we tried to right it, it went over and over on us," Grattau related, "finally I straddled it. Billy went under it and that was the last

I saw of him." Tom Gillespie, 16, of Golfvlew Ave., and Bill Shannon, 15, of Kingston Rd., lying on the bank nearby heard Grattan's shouts for neip. Gillespie swam out and pulled him to shore and Shannon recovered
