was found to be polio. There has been no paralysis. This was the third case in the city this year. Only one resident case has been reported, a girl, six who recovered from an attack in late March. Total of three to date is the same to this point last year. Since the end of the Second World War jobs have been found in Canada for 80,000 disabled and physically handicapped persons.

### \$40,000 Dairy Herd Unpaying, To Be Sold

Another Ontario prize dairy herd is going on the auction block. Unsatisfactory returns and the difficulty in obtaining adequate labor are given as the reasons for the sale on June 25 at Oakville of 75 Ayrshires which are valued at \$40,000 by their owner, Col. W. E. Phillips, of Oriole.

The dairy herd will be replaced by purebred beef cattle. Ayrshire breeders in the province see the Phillips sale as a loss to the dairy industry for it represents 13 years of careful breeding and selection of herd sires.

This is the second prize dairy herd to go up for sale on June 25. George S. Henry, former premier of Ontario and neighbor of Col. Phillips, announced earlier that his Holstein herd would be sold at auction, due to the labor problem, as well as rapid housing development in the area.

Erie Kitchen, secretary of the Dairy Farmers of Canada, said he doubted if dairy farmers would switch completely to beef cattle. Just the same, he added, dairy farmers insist that if it wasn't for the stock they sell they couldn't keep operating. "Milk won't carry a herd alone."

Col. Phillips acquired his herd—originally the Mercon herd—in 1943. The blood lines have been continually strengthened by importations from Scotland.

One prize cow being sold is Park Jubilee Radio, which took first in the aged cow class at the Royal Winter Fair in 1946. A Gold Seal producer, she has given more than 125,000 pounds of milk and holds eight honor roll records.

The prize bull of the Phillips Wynyates Farm, Wynyates Imperial Illustrater AA, will also be sold. This bull has won first prize at the Royal.

### No School Not Our Fault - School Board

The school board of Whitechurch Township S.S. 13 placed the blame for lack of a new school in the district on the shoulders of the arbitration board at a meeting held Monday evening.

The board under chairmanship of A. E. Patchell passed a resolution disclaiming any responsibility for delay in building a new school, saying all documents pertaining to acquisition of a suitable property were passed by it three months ago.

The arbitration board has not yet expropriated this property, the resolution claimed, and only three months remain in which to get another site and erect a school for the fall term.

The school board is asking that another site be obtained immediately to enable an architect to begin work immediately in hopes of having a school ready by Sept. 1.

### Uninvited Guest at Dance, Skunk Stops Music, Then Departs

A skunk which arrived at a country dance in a Brant Township home was given the cold shoulder by both boys and girls. Even the orchestra stopped playing until the animal left the room.

Bob Becker, violinist, was sitting near the back door when the skunk came through the doorway and perched itself at the fiddler's feet.

Mr. Becker stopped the music and froze. The dancers, having no music, looked around and withdrew through a door on the other side of the room.

The skunk circled the floor and returned again to the still frozen violinist. Finally the pesky little animal crawled out the back door, leaving not a trace of odor behind him.

"I had a brand new suit on and I didn't even breathe when that skunk was next to me," said Becker.

### Oshawa Presbytery Wins Drama Playoff

The Greenwood United Church Young People's Union was declared the winner at Port Hope, June 5th, when they competed with the winners of two other Presbyteries in the Drama Festival Play-offs.

A Drama Festival was held in Oshawa, April 27th, when four one-act plays were presented and the Greenwood Union took the Presbytery cup with their humorous fantasy "Cracked Ice." This gave them the opportunity to uphold the Presbytery in the Conference Drama Festival play-offs.

Mr. Peter McKone of Peterboro, who was the adjudicator, said "Cracked Ice" was an ambitious choice for a young group. However, the Greenwood Union of the Oshawa Presbytery were to be commended for their effort—change the set to suit the story. The wind, snow and frost also added to the realism but could have been used more. Joe Pegg and Ted Curl, who played the main parts, were commended for clear speaking and making their points with action. Jean Pascoe as "Beautiful" received a word of praise for her embraces.

### Prohibit Canoe Rentals To All Under 21, Pickering Chief Asks

A bylaw prohibiting the renting of canoes to persons under 21 years of age was urged by Pickering Township Police Chief Lockhart Trinnell following a fatal canoe accident in the Rouge River recently.

Billy Dobson, 12, Kingston Rd., was drowned and his companion Gordon Grattan, 9, also of Kingston Rd. was saved when their canoe overturned.

"Canoes are upsetting all the time," complained Chief Trinnell. "It is a wonder there hasn't been more drownings."

He said the section of the river in which the boy was drowned was running fast and the wind blowing.

"It would have taken an expert to keep a canoe upright in that water," he said.

The Grattan boy told police the canoe upset when "Billy stood up to swat a bird that went past."

"The canoe turned over and over and when we tried to right it, it went over and over on us," Grattan related, "finally I straddled it. Billy went under it and that was the last I saw of him."

Tom Gillespie, 16, of Golfview Ave., and Hill Shannon, 15, of Kingston Rd., lying on the bank nearby heard Grattan's shouts for help. Gillespie swam out and pulled him to shore and Shannon recovered the boat.

The body of the Dobson boy was recovered two hours later by Highland Creek firemen.

Both boys had gone out to the river on their bicycles and rented the canoe for an hour. They told the attendant they could both swim.
