Marlboros Out of Sr. Hockey, Believe Not Wanted

Assistant-general manager of Maple Leaf Gardens, Clarence (Hap) Day and Marlboro president Harold Ballard startled a meeting of the OHA subcommittee Monday night with the announcement that the Marlboros will withdraw from senior calibre hockey for one season-at least.

The announcement came at a meeting to organize a new Senior "A" Group in Ontario. Represented were Chatham, Sarnia, Brantford, Kitchener, Stratford, Hamilton, Niagara Falls, and Owen Sound, as well as Toronto.

Earlier, Ballard had told the meeting that Marlboros would be willing, as a last resort, to reduce the calibre of the club to Senior 'A' level. Later, however, he indicated that he felt that other interested clubs would prefer to operate without a Toronto Marlboro club.

"It appears we are not wanted in the group," Ballard said suddenly. "Therefore, we will suspend operations for this season and we are willing to release players to other clubs provided that they be returned should we re-enter senior or major hockey."

Day backed Ballard's statement. "From the feeling of this meeting, we would have to force inferior hockey on the public. We don't want to do that," he said.

Although details still to be settled appear mountainous, there undoubtedly will be a strong Senior 'A' league in Ontario next winter. Before the meeting was over, six

teams definitely indicated that they would be in, and two others wanted a week before making a decision. The six definite starters were Chatham, Sarnia, Brantford, Kitchener, Stratford, and Niagara Falls. Hamilton and Owen Sound are to decide within a week.




