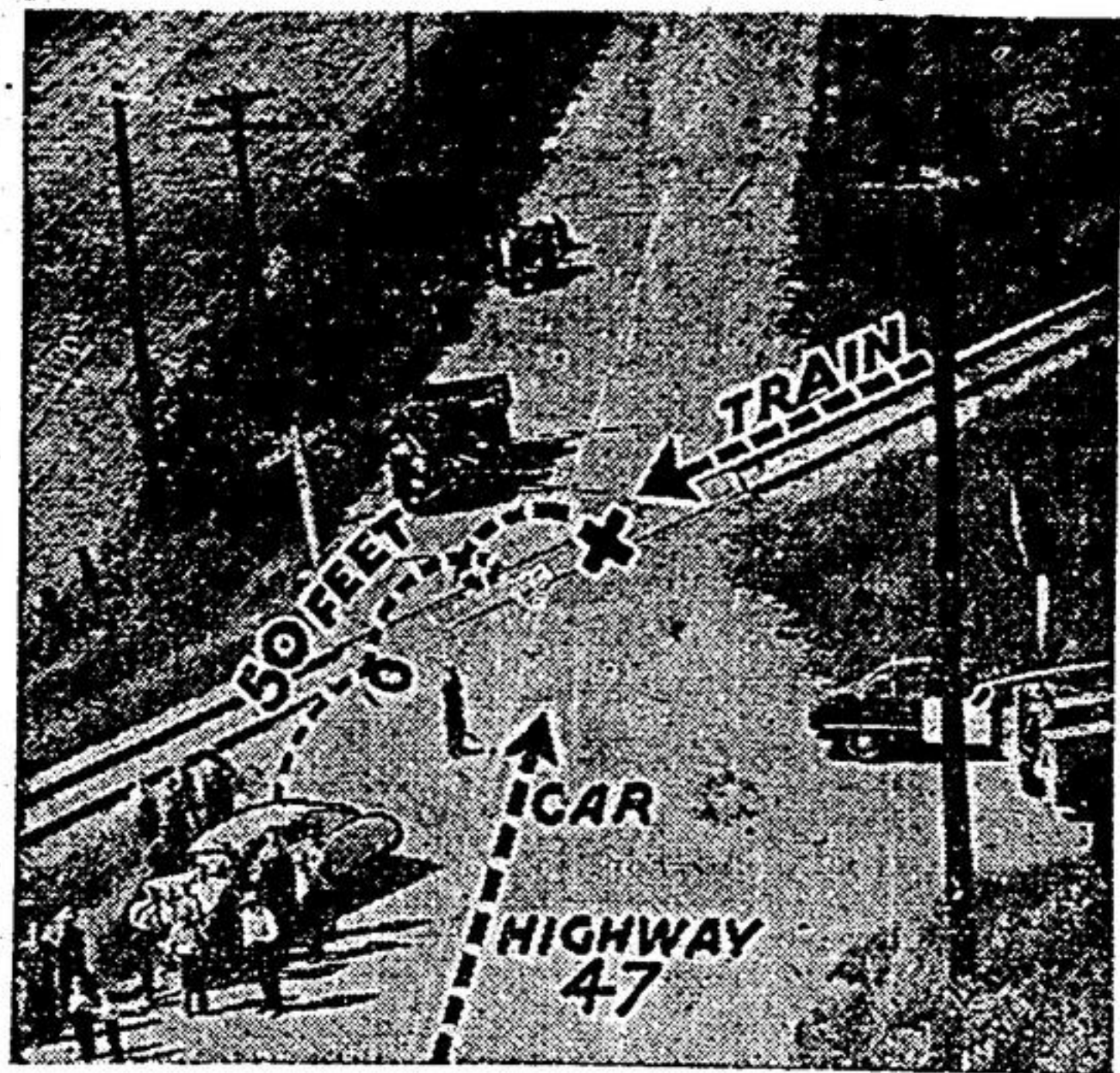
Mrs. Fanny Gayman, 69, Dies Following Stroke

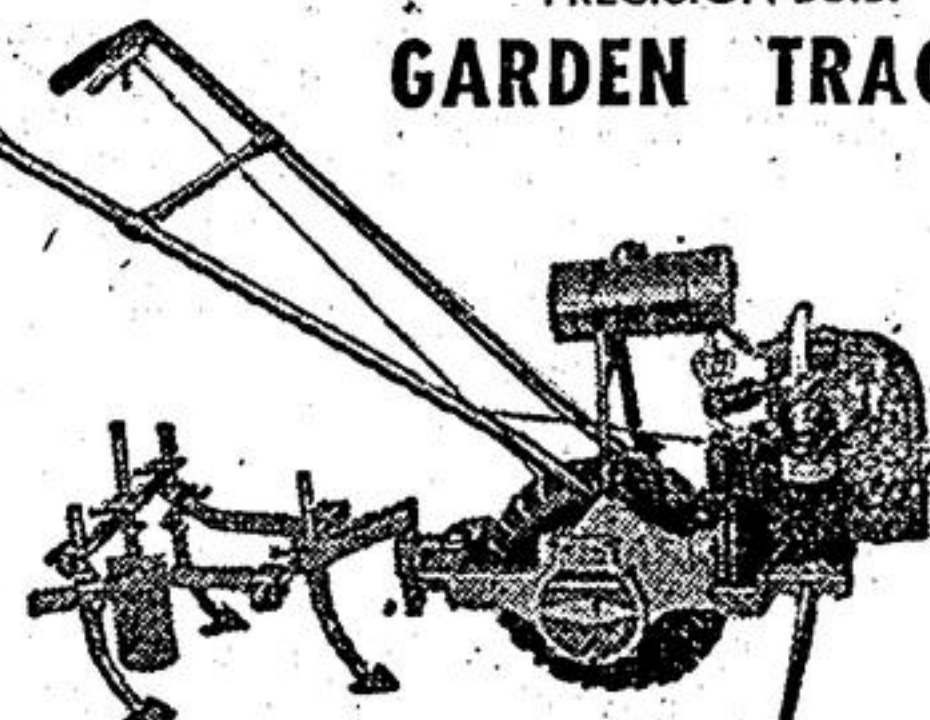
