## POISON KILLS FIVE HEIFERS

An insecticide used in spraying orchards has been blamed for the death of five heifers owned by Mrs. E. J. Meagher, Dundas highway at Oakville. Mrs. Meagher, who estimates her loss at between \$5,000 and \$6,000, said the poison had a copper and lead base. She said the heifers picked it up in a pasture "about ten days after my orchard was sprayed with the same type of poison."

Ten other animals in the pasture did not get any of the poison, leading police to believe there was only a small quantity involved.

## ALLERGIC HORSE DIES IN THE HARNESS

On Monday while in the process of hauling in a load of hay on the farm of Mr. A. Bartholomew on the 9th concession, north of Stouffville, one horse in the team driven by the son George became ill and began to gasp for breath. Local Veterinarian Dr. Ron Smith was called to the scene three times and administered injections of penicillin to the animal but without success. It was at first believed that the horse had died from poisoning but that fact was denied by the attending veterinarian who diagnosed the case as an allergy. The animal evidently came in contact with a certain kind of grass or weed of which it was allergic later developing pneumonia causing its death.
