

Inside the main door, the whole section is all different kinds of fox; platinum, silver blue and cross from Canada, Norway, Sweden and Denmark. These are ranch raised pelts but thousands of white fox from Greenland, Canada and Russia are all trapped. Red fox are merely baled in huge stacks in an area of about thirty feet by twenty. Next section is mink, and I was surprised to find that the Russian wild mink is generally superior in size, color and quality of fur to any other country. The Japanese mink and muskrat are like the people in that country, smaller and a lighter color than those from colder places. Apparently there is no shortage of beaver in Canada and Russia for there are thousands of the soft glossy pelts in the warehouse.






