### Illegal Hunters in Whitchurch Township

They could have been two "city slickers" out for a Saturday afternoon's shot, but the two hunters who came across the fields at Hazleburn Farm and asked Miss Maude Driver if she had seen two little foxes were either unaware of the laws of Whitchurch Township, or boldly ignoring them. Both men carried guns and said they had sighted the foxes in a field but had lost track of them before they could take aim. So states the Aurora Banner.

Mrs. Aemilius Jarvis, disturbed over the trespassers, realized that the so-called foxes were her two Border terriers which had been coveting in the clover. "From a distance they could be mistaken for foxes," she said, asking the Banner office for information regarding the hunting-by-law pertaining to the township. "We have no foxes in this block, yet in the past we have been pestered with hunters," said Mrs. Jarvis.

The township clerk's office when contacted disclosed the following information, quoted from the by-law by Mr. Les Harper, assistant clerk: "No shooting is allowed in the Township except for groundhogs. In that case, a special licence, which must be countersigned by a conservation officer, is issued. In no case may anyone carry a gun on Sunday."

### Cut in Fox Bounty Brings Sharp Drop In Number Killed

From ancient times the fox has been said to be a wise animal, some proof of this theory might be found in comparison of the fox bounties paid out by the County of Ontario in the past three years.

Or put it this way: when the bounty is high, foxes apparently crowd within the borders of the county to be shot, so that their pelts will bear high bounty paid there, rather than the lower bounties paid by adjoining counties. But the picture has changed since the first of 1951. The local bounty has been reduced from \$5 to \$3 to conform with the neighbouring counties. Whether the foxes got wise, or whether the hunters see little gain at the rate of \$3 a pelt, the claims have been greatly reduced so far this year, according to figures compiled by Miss Lambe of the County Treasurer's office.

The happy feature of the picture is that the taxpayers this year will pay only about \$3,300 as compared with \$8,000 in 1949.

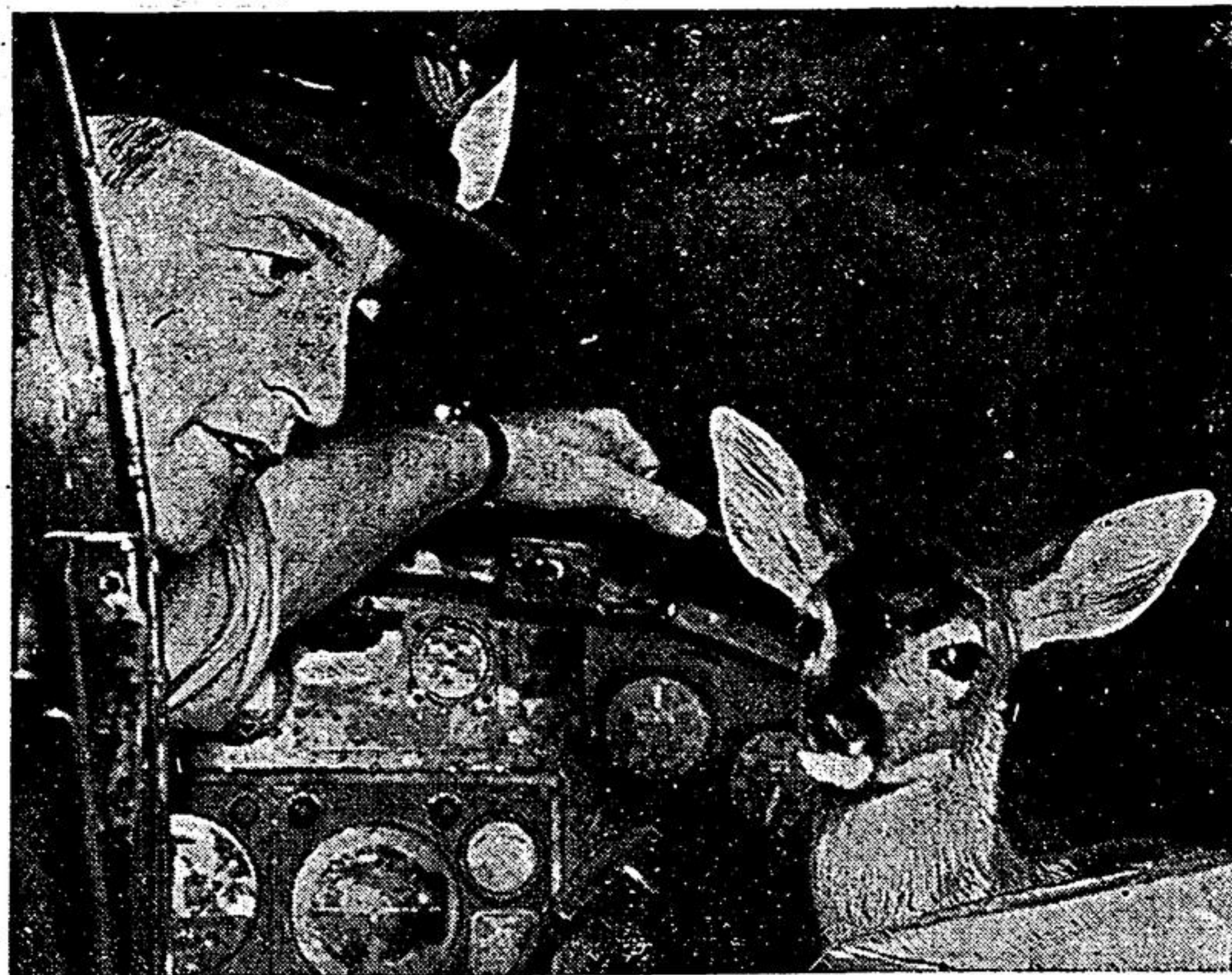

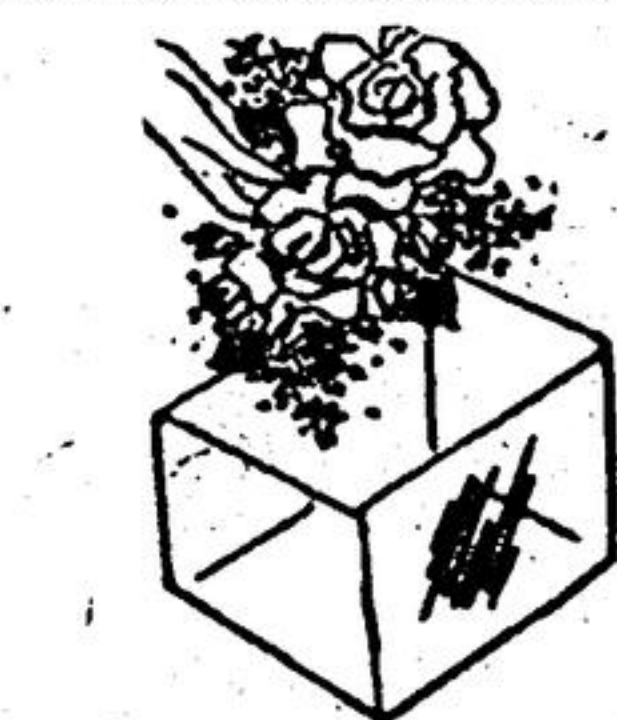
