## Hatchet-Wielding Youth Admits Theft of Gormley Stand

William Bagshaw, 14 year old youth of 296 Borden St. Toronto, broke down and admitted the theft of a vegetable stand at Gormley last week and was given suspended sentence by Judge Webster of Toronto Juvenile Court. The youth was seen by a passing motorist and when questioned about his loitering around the vegetable stand, owned by Mrs. Frank Harvey the well built lad brandished a hatchet and made off with a quantity of cash from the till located on the stand.

The youth proceeded to make his way to Lake Simcoe and then back to his home in Toronto. When questioned by his mother the young boy admitted everything and the police were summoned. A bicycle also stolen by the youth was dropped by the court and no charge was laid on that count. P.C. Harvey Cox carried out the investigation.

## Two-Year Search Ends at Sutton

The kind of perseverance that has paid off so many times for Scotland Yard, has brought success to the Port Credit, Ontario, Police Department.

With only a snapshot of suspected thief to go on, Police Chief Joseph Nelson and Sergeant Edward Boehner tracked their man for two months over two thousand miles of Ontario and Quebec. The police pair were looking for a thief who stole a one-thousand dollar public address system at the Port Credit Carnival in June. They caught up with the equipment in a Quebec carnival.

But the suspected thief himself wasn't arrested until Saturday night at Sutton, when police recognized a man lounging at the carnival gate. The clincher was a scar on the man's thumb. Police say he has many aliases— including Paul Morand, Camille Marada, Paul White and George Moran. He's 38 years old and has no fixed address. He will be charged with theft.
