Whitchurch Not Yet Ready for Health Unit - McCarron

"Couldn't we make joining of York County Health Unit our next project?" asked Mrs. C. L. Stephenson at the last regular meeting of Lake Wilcox Ratepayers.
"No," said Mr. McCarron, saying that as a member of Whitchurch Township Council he would vote against it. Taxpayers wouldn't get anything for the \$1,800 it would cost, he asserted, saying that Dr. King, director of the unit, had admitted at Stouffville that nothing extra would be secured over and above the present system. Council had been petitioned to join the Health Unit on several occasions, Mr. McCarron said.

Climaxed by the resignation as a trustee of James Anderson, long-time secretary-treasurer of the old Lake Wilcox Association, which recently merged with the Oak Ridges-Lake Wilcox Ratepayers Association, a long discussion on the suggested recommendation by the executive of a change of name for the organization resulted in the general meeting on Tuesday authorizing continuance of the old name.
The executive had unanimously agreed at its last meeting. President E. L. McCarron told those present, to recommend a change of name from the Oak Ridges-Lake Wilcox Ratepayers Association to the Lake Wilcox-Oak Ridges Community and Ratepayers Association. He asked Mr. Anderson to speak on behalf of those favouring the alteration. The organization was now more than a ratepayers' association, Mr. Anderson stated. A broader field was being covered and the group had two functions. One was to look after the interests of taxpayers and the other was to improve community life for all residents.

C. L. Stephenson, speaking on behalf of those not in favour of the change, said that the proposed new name was unwieldy. When a vote was taken 13 were in favour of the change and 16 opposed.

After the vote was taken Mr. Anderson, who said that he had been a resident of Lake Wilcox for thirty years and was one of those who had helped build the present community hall, claimed that summer residents who had contributed much were being slighted. He had felt the trend for some time, he stated, tendering his resignation verbally and saying that he would confirm it in writing. Nothing was being taken from anyone, said President McCarron, pointing out that both associations which had merged were composed of practically the same people.

Better Care for Pioneer Cemeteries - Deputy-Reeve McEwen

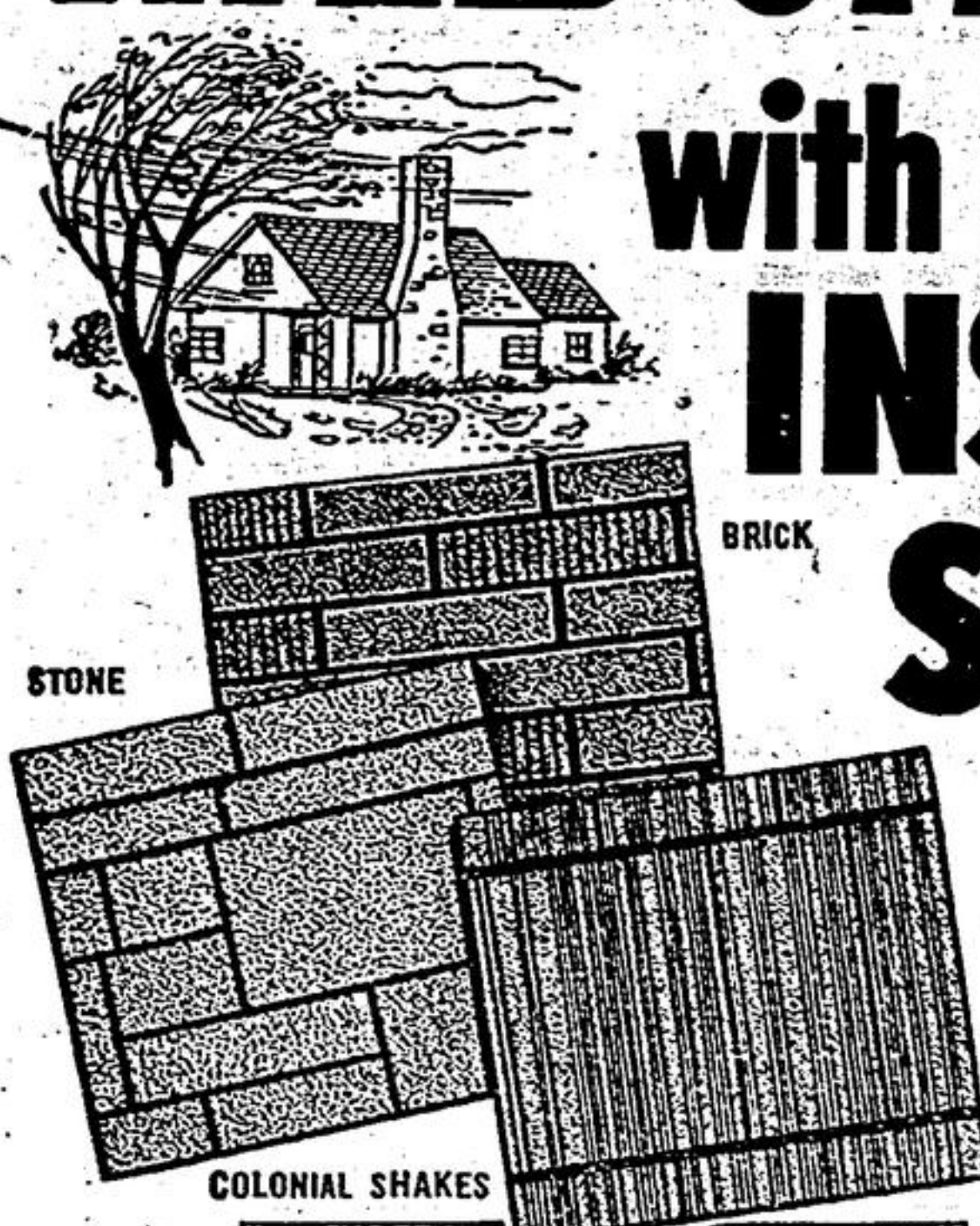
A suggestion that neglected cemeteries in the county wherein lie the pioneers, many of whom labored to build the county at great sacrifices to themselves, might be fenced and transformed into reforestation plots was advanced at County Council Wednesday morning by Deputy-Reeve Neil McEwen of Pickering Township. He would have this work of tree planting done by the municipalities in which these cemeteries were located, under county supervision, and the fencing paid for by the county. The expense would not be great for a county which did not hesitate to spend \$50,000 at a time on a single project. He felt that the Department of Lands and Forests would supply the trees to the county. In two years after the planting they would become perpetual monuments to the men and women who labored long and well in order that we of today might enjoy a goodly heritage.
Deputy-Reeve McEwen said that many of the last resting places of our pioneers were pasture fields and fence corners, and that tombstones were either badly broken up or had disappeared altogether. "These pioneers are the people who made the county of Ontario, sacrificing their time, ambition, and desires to establish the county which we enjoy today," Dr. McEwen said, adding that he felt that the county should see that all cemeteries were cleaned up and maintained to honor the memory of the early settlers. He suggested setting up boards or committees in each municipality to do this work in conjunction with the county.
Several members of the Council said that in their townships much work along this line had been done, the municipalities in some cases contributing funds. It was admitted however, that there are some places in the county neglected,

which should have attention, and the consensus of opinion was that this was the responsibility of the municipalities where no boards or other organizations existed to maintain them.
It was pointed out that in many cases there are no relatives left

of many who now rest in many of the county's cemeteries so that it is impossible to obtain donations toward their maintenance. One suggestion was that in cases where cemetery boards existed legacies might be forthcoming from people who are interested in having the

cemeteries maintained. The Council passed a resolution instructing the clerk to write to the clerks of all municipalities asking to bring before Councils a request that boards be set up to look after the cemeteries in their municipalities.
