## Uxbridge and Scott Asked for \$10,000 Hospital Support

Mayor R. J. Harris of Uxbridge brought to the regular meeting of Uxbridge Township council on Tuesday evening, plans for the new \$200,000 hospital to be erected in Uxbridge.

The project is to be financed through public subscription, government grant and taxation. Mr. Harris informed council that already some \$45,000 had been raised and another \$25,000 had been pledged by hospital supporters. A total of \$10,000 was the amount of contribution expected from the townships of Uxbridge and Scott. Reach was being asked to provide \$7,000 and Brock \$3,000.

The work on the new project is expected to begin sometime next spring, if the necessary support is forthcoming in the meantime. It was the opinion of the township councillors that a contribution involving such a large sum should be placed before the people, and it was suggested by Clerk Ashenurst that this might be done at the next annual election date.

Councillor Ball stated that he believed the question should be placed before the electors whether a municipal election was held or not. Uxbridge Township's share of the \$10,000 grant would raise the municipal tax rate by one mill, it was believed.

Council spent some time in discussing the railway move to make Goodwood a whistle stop. Council lodged a protest against the move some months ago.

No definite action was taken to establish a cemetery board to deal with delapidated burying grounds as proposed by County Council. It was generally agreed that many of these sacred plots were poorly tended, but the matter of setting up a board to deal with the matter of renovation was deferred.

Accounts passed for payment amounted to \$52.28 with the road bills totalling \$525.17.

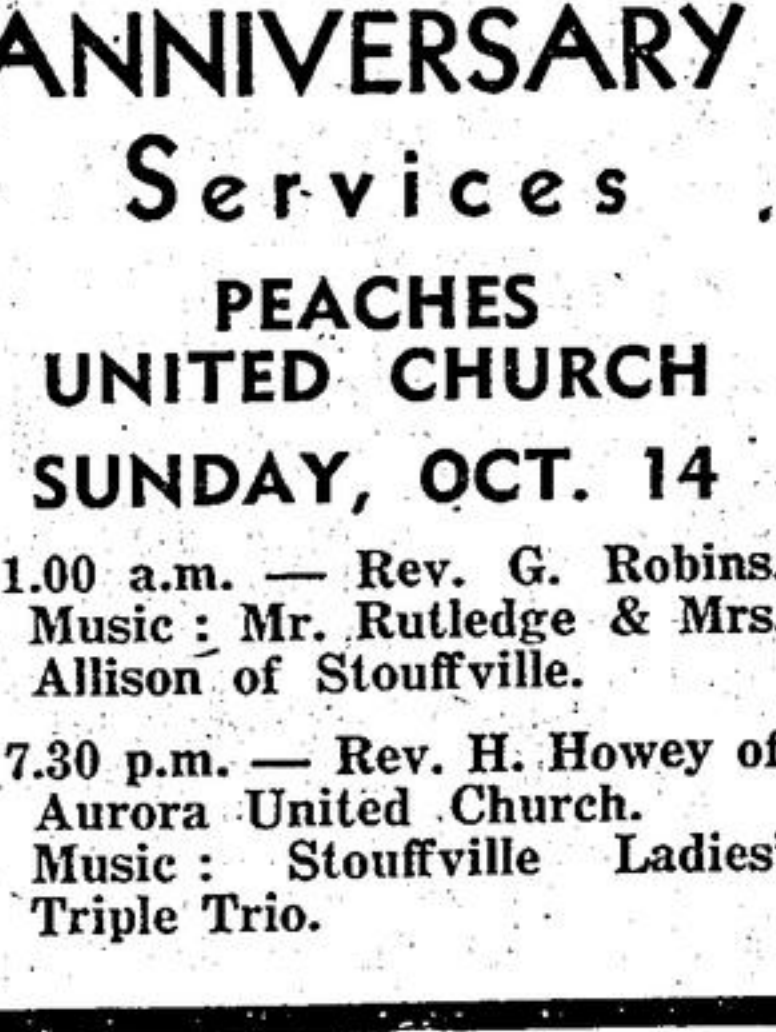
