Outstanding Stars Here For Star Concert

The Commodores, Canada's most popular quartet, and "The Video-ettes," equally celebrated Swiss bell-ringing team, are coming to town for a Star Weekly Free Concert. The program will be held at 8 p.m. on Thursday, Dec. 6th in Stouffville United Church. Doors open at 7 p.m.

They say nothing is an unmixed blessing and The Commodores are a case in point. The last world war produced them. If it hadn't happened there's little doubt this foursome of kindred spirits never would have met.

Harvard Reddick, first tenor, is

from Port Simpson, B.C.; Carl Tapscott, second tenor and arranger for the group, is a Toronto man; John Ringham, baritone, comes from Vancouver; and Donald Parrish, bass, calls Wallaceburg, Ont., his home.

During the war these young men were members of a large singing chorus in the Canadian "Navy Show." The company travelled a great deal and on tour these fellows got together for some close-harmony sessions. They began then to pass the time, but soon they were performing for the whole troupe.

Officials promptly took them out of the chorus and started them separately as "The Commodores" quartet. They were a tremendous success when the show gave a command performance in London, England.

Since those early days the boys, assisted by Leo Lighter at the piano, have toured widely and acquired that smooth showmanship which has raised them to the top.

"The Video-ettes," in private life Art and Mabel Guinness, shot to fame on their first important engagement in Toronto where they've remained ever since, two of the most popular persons in the entertainment business. They came originally from Vancouver.

The auspicious beginning was more than two years ago in Massey Hall during the four-night Toronto Symphony orchestra's "Christmas Box" concert. In that revue of the best available talent "The Video-ettes" easily stole the show. They repeated that triumph the following year.

Ballantrae Driver Collides with Train At Holland Landing

A gravel truck driven by Bob Radford of Ballantrae was completely wrecked in collision with a freight train at Holland Landing on Thursday afternoon. Radford was taken to York County hospital suffering from a badly broken left arm, cuts about the face and possible internal injuries.
