School levy arrears

YORK CTY. - As of Dec. 31, the sum of \$3,262,306 remained outstanding from seven municipalities for school levy purposes.

Final payment of the levies was due Sept. 15. As reported at the December 21 meeting of the York County Board of Education, the Township of Georgina owed \$171,787; the Township of East Gwillimbury \$562,321; the Township of North Gwillimbury \$213,243; the Town of Newmarket \$509,261; the Village of Sutton \$42,000; the Township of Vaughan \$1,608,931 and the Village of Woodbridge \$155,763.

As of Dec. 15, the sum of \$110,000 was due or paid to the board for interest on late payments. A total of \$11,000 has been paid out to municipalities as interest on advance payments. Superintendent of Business George Ford reported Dec. 23, that a cheque for \$1,000,000 had been received from Vaughan Township that day.
